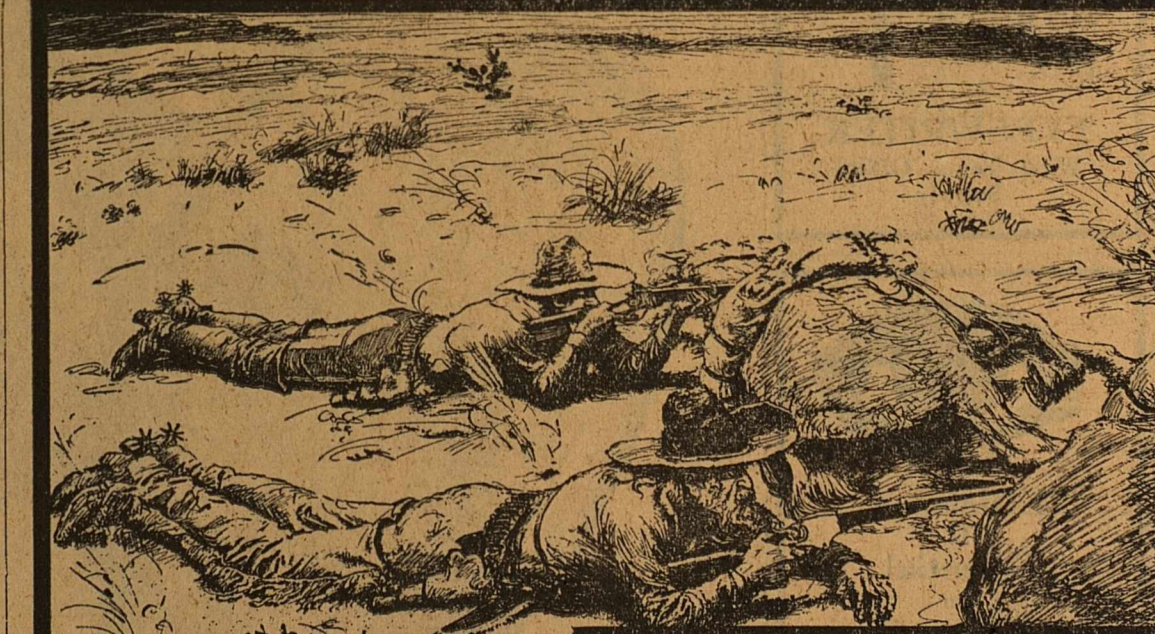

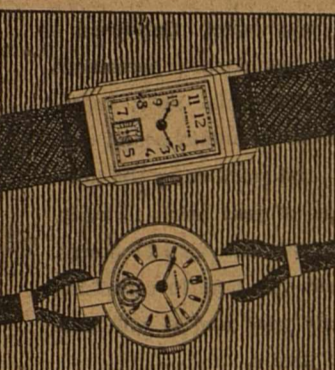

long time — The plot thickens! 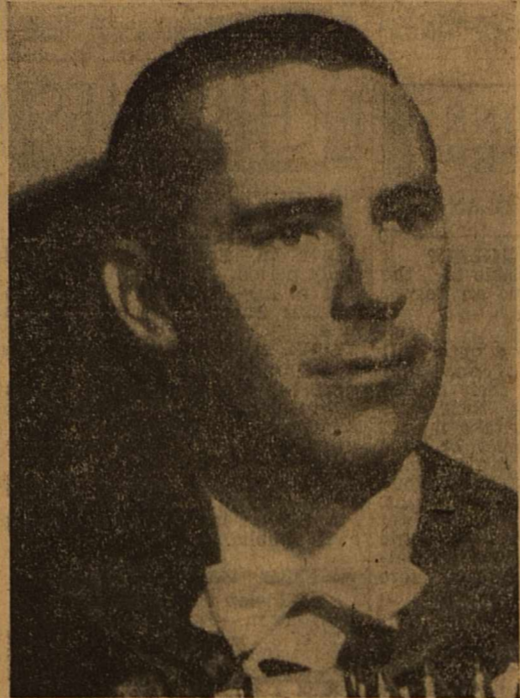
### 10 Million Spent By British In Trying to Win Cup

LONDON (U.P.)—In 86 years Britain's has spent more than \$10,000,000 trying to win an old silver cup whose value has dropped from \$500 to \$85 during that time. It is the America's Cup, most coveted trophy of the yachting world of Britain and the United States, another race for which is scheduled in September, 1937. Since the schooner America won the first cup presented by the Royal Yacht Squadron for a race around the Isle of Wight, in 1851, Britain has made 15 unsuccessful attempts to win it. The last was in 1934 when Rainbow beat Endeavour by four races to two.

Now Thomas Sopwith, millionaire airplane manufacturer, is building an Endeavour II, to race against America's best next year. The all-steel "J" class yacht will have extensive trials at all the regattas around the British coast this summer. Designed by Nicholson Like Endeavour I, Charles E. Nicholson is the designer, with some of Sopwith's notions about air-currents and stream-line embodied in it. It will be an all-Empire product, with steel from Cumberland, England, mahogany from British Honduras, yellow pine from Western Canada, and cotton from the Sudan, woven in the small market town of Crewkerne, Somerset. She is being built at Camper and Nicholson's famous yard, Gosport, near Portsmouth. The sails are being cut and shaped in an adjoining loft where about 133 years ago the sails of Nelson's flagship, Victory, were made before the battle of Trafalgar.

An approximate idea of Endeavour II's size may be gained from the following measurements. Her extreme length from the tip of her long pointed bow to her counter will be about 132 feet, while her length on the waterline is to be 87 feet, and her extreme beam will probably be 22 1-2 feet. Her draft, meaning the depth she is in the water, from her waterline to the bottom of her keel, is 15 feet, and she will be of 164 tons displacement. The great Bermudian mainsail will be 153 feet from deck to peak. Hull Like Giant Shark Hull formation has changed considerably since 1851. The new challenger's bow is like a half-spear, and equally as sharp on the extreme nose, while the hull fits fins out to the counter very much like the tail of a large fish. The hull generally follows the lines of a giant shark.

### Pancho Villa Had Sweet Tooth, Penchant For Killing Chinks and Romantic Heart

HOUSTON, Tex. (U.P.)—Pancho Villa, Mexico's notorious revolutionist, had a sweet tooth, an unexplained lust for killing Chinese, and a romantic heart. But to Capt. Aurelio Reynosa and Lieut. Gustavo R. Ypina, one-time members of Villa's army, he was to Mexico as Gen. Sam Houston was to Texas, a great liberator. Reynosa and Ypina, friends since

they joined Villa in 1919, at Agua Calientes, bear three scars each from bullet wounds—"medals" of past campaigns. Reynosa is now an ice man and Ypina a jeweler. Memories of Mexico's Robin Hood have not been dimmed by the years since the revolution of 1914-1916 for Reynosa and Ypina, who believe Villa was one of their native coun-

try's greatest heroes. "The Mexican people are just now beginning to appreciate what he did for them," Ypina said. "He was a great patriot. Some say he was just a bandit, but he was the only man in Mexico's history who disposed of two tyrants and then with the power to become dictator, disbanded his armies and gave the government back to the people and retired to private life. How many Mexican leaders with his power would have done that?" Ypina declared that Villa was not the dark, uncouth, illiterate killer that he had been pictured to Americans.

"Villa was over six feet tall and weighed about 220 pounds," he said. "His complexion was light. His mustache was red as fire and his hair a deep auburn. His physical strength was exceeded only by his skill with a gun. "You've heard about it that he couldn't read or write. That's a lie. He could do both well. I know that, for I was with him almost constantly for two years while he received and gave orders."

The revolutionary chieftain gained his gory reputation not through his own deeds, Reynosa and Ypina declared, but through his lieutenant Fierro. "Fierro was a killer—the worst I ever saw," Reynosa said. "He killed hundreds of people. Some of them were Villa's own men. I've seen him shoot men and women in cold blood. When he couldn't kill people, he went down to the stockyards and shot cattle."

The former revolutionists verified the incident in which the governor-general was placed on an ant-hill, daubed with honey and left to be devoured slowly by insects. "But they got what they deserved," they avowed. "He was one of the Assassins of Madero whom Villa loved and had made president of Mexico when he deposed Diaz in 1911."

They said the bandit king never went out of his way to kill anybody except Chinese. "He used to hang them by their queues to watch them kick," Reynosa said. "Then he would shoot them. Nobody ever knew why he hated the Chinese. But he never forgot to look them up when he entered a city."

"Villa didn't drink or smoke, but his love for sweets and women led to an international incident. "When we got to Mexico City after deposing Victoriano Huerta," Ypina recalled, "the first thing Villa did was go to a hotel for imperial candy. "A French blonde was the candy girl there. Villa bought his candy and came back again and again. The French girl encouraged him. "Later," they continued, "she became impatient and ran to the French ambassador asking protection. Well, the ambassador threatened

and so did Cilla but their friends smoothed things over and Villa laughed and went about his business."

"El Gran Bandido" succeeded because he was fearless, a great leader and had the respect of his men, Reynosa and Ypina declared. "We went over the top 25 times within three months on one campaign. And who do you think led us each time? Villa. He carried all details of his campaign in his head. He never forgot anything. He could give orders without hesitat-

ing." Villa was assassinated. Reynosa and Ypina are alive, they said, only because they were not captured by the federals. "When they captured our men they stood them up against a wall and shot them down like dogs."
