Packing Plants On Gulf Are Requested

DALLAS, (AP)—W. B. Mitchell, Marfa, livestock producer, believes the next step in Texas's cattle industry should be construction of packing plants along the Gulf coast.

"Slaughtering plants along the Gulf coast would solve the problem of exports and that of Texas beef returning from Chicago and other points by rail," he said. "From slaughter houses meat could be shipped directly to different parts of Texas and to the meat-eating states of the Atlantic seaboard by water, cheapest of present-day methods."

Because such a program will take years to get under way, Mitchell told the Dallas Agriculture Club recently that it should be started immediately.

"What we need in Texas is a definite livestock program," he said. "The day has come when livestock men must find new markets for their animals. With the Eastern and middle Western states going in for cattle raising on a larger scale than ever before, Texas should develop home markets and find a way of cutting out the useless time and freight charges now employed in getting beef to the heavy meat-consuming states along the Atlantic seaboard."

Wooden Water Tank At Silsbee Collapses

SILSBE, Texas (AP)—The Kirby railroad wooden water tank here, located opposite the commissary and used to fill log-engines, collapsed with a resounding crash last week. It stood on a 15-foot high foundation, was about 12 feet high and 15 feet in diameter. As nearly as can be ascertained it was built 30 years ago.
