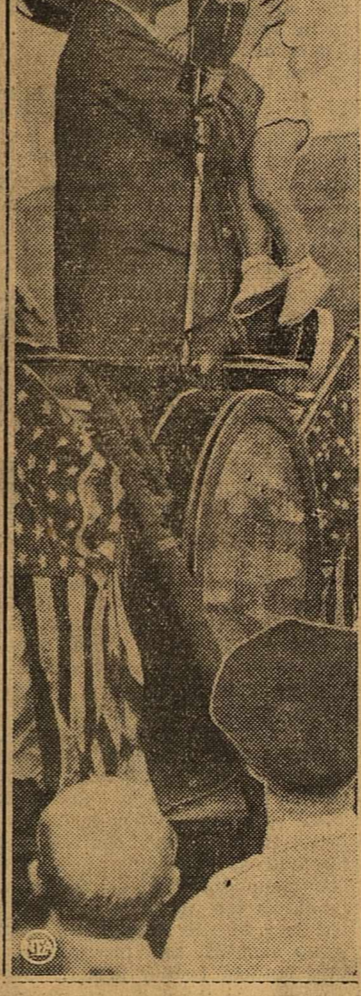

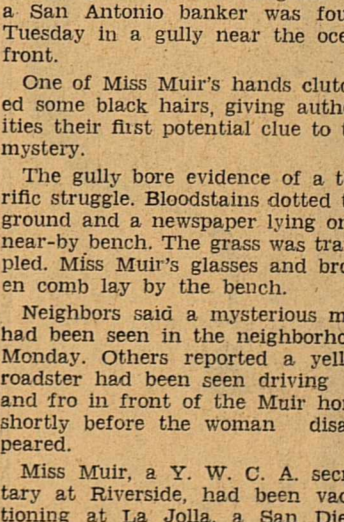

Some Questions and Answers Concerning Old-Age Benefits Provisions

Editor's Note: The following article has been released by the Social Security Board of Texas to better acquaint employees, employers and pension eligibles of the National Social Security Act.

Q. 3. Will monthly federal old age retirement benefits be paid to everyone after the age of 65? A. No. In order to receive monthly old age retirement benefits from the federal government at the age of 65, individuals must have been employed in at least 5 different calendar years after 1936 in which they were engaged in industry and commerce, and their wages from such employment must be at least a total of \$2,000.

# "Little Moltke" Bosses Greece

LONDON, Sept. 2.—Hated of republicanism, bottled up for 15 years, recently exploded in General Metaxas, plump, short, middle-aged, bespectacled Premier-dictator of Greece, with the result that his country was put under martial law, Parliament was sent about its business, and the liberal-sounding constitution was made into another of those famous European scraps of paper.

Metaxas has been waiting for a very long time for his one glorious hour—the hour in which he was to avenge all the griefs and humiliations he and the royalist cause had suffered for many troubled years. Now at last he is on top and will stay there—until some other leader lures the Greek army away from him. That has been the story of Greece in many of its recent civil wars and coups d'etat.

**Likened to Moltke**  
By Fellow Students  
Metaxas, sprung from one of the families of the ruling caste, was educated mainly in German military schools. He was right at the top of his class records, his German fellow students dubbing him "Der kleine Moltke"—"the little Moltke," the latter being one of the greatest soldiers Germany has produced in modern times. Metaxas, of course, returned to his own country and

entered the army. Equally, of course, he brought back with him a life-long feeling of friendship for Germany and German things and German causes.

In the Balkan wars of 1912 he was Assistant Chief of Staff of the then Crown Prince Constantine. They formed a close friendship which lasted for life. When "Tino," as he was known to his intimates, mounted the throne in 1913, Metaxas was of the inner circle of the court.

The World War of 1914 put Tino right square up against a situation in which he had to make a decision. The interests of Greece seemed to demand siding with the Allies. But Tino had married the sister of Kaiser Wilhelm. At his side were such pro-Germans as Metaxas. Tino hoped for neutrality and that put him in square opposition to Venizelos, the great statesman who was so many times Premier of Greece.

**Venizelos' Influence Sowed Great Hatred**  
From that time dated the hatred of Metaxas for Venizelos and for all republicans. In the years that followed when King Constantine had to get out of Greece, Metaxas left with him. When Tino came back Metaxas came along. Upon the death of Tino, the stout general was just as loyal to his old master's son King George. When the latter had to leave Greece, Metaxas for a time

left also. But he got back in 1924, took a leading part in squelching the rebellion led by friends of Venizelos and played a large part in the return of King George to his throne and country.

What suppressing the rebellion did for him was much, but death did still more. In quick succession it removed General Condylis, M. Venizelos and M. Tsaldaris. This left Metaxas as the one strong man in the country. But he was not entirely happy. He decreed an election for a new Parliament. His own party only won seven seats. It made part of an anti-Venizelist coalition which comprised 143 members in all. The friends of the late Venizelos, largely republican won 142 seats. The Communist faction of 15, therefore could swing the Parliament either way. The Royalists hated the Venizelists too much to form a coalition with them. The Venizelists could not and would not make a deal with the Reds. Deadlock, therefore, ensued until both big combinations, in utter weariness, agreed that a Metaxas cabinet should rule by decree for five months.

**Communist Activity Was Excuse for Coup**  
In the meantime, Metaxas wondered how he could quash the Communists and maneuver an election in which his side would have a better chance to get a parliamentary majority. Strikes in the tobacco

factories of Salonika and threatened ones in Athens gave him the opportunity which he quickly seized. He convinced the weak King that only prompt action would save the throne, the Monarchy and the country. The present martial law is the result. Metaxas adopted the parrot cry which dictators have taken up all over Europe—"We have got to save the nation from the Communist danger!"

The fact is that there was very little chance of an actual, serious Communist uprising, but the working classes of Greece are in a very bad humor. Metaxas was putting into effect decrees which made arbitration in labor disputes mandatory. Labor thought he had sold their cause to the employers. Furthermore, the government was claiming the right to have a hand in the disposition of the funds of the labor unions. On top of this the cost of living had risen and the average working class family has been earning not more than \$20 per month and often even less. The bad weather has injured the currant and fruit crop. The wheat crop is down twenty percent. The exports of Greece were badly hurt by the enforcement of economic sanctions against Italy imposed by the League of Nations because of the war on Ethiopia. So that the mass of the people are dissatisfied with the regime.

## BEHIND THE SCENES IN WASHINGTON

NEW YORK, Sept. 2.—It is almost axiomatic in politics that the presidential candidate who carries New York state wins the national election. The exception was Charles Evans Hughes, who carried New York, but lost the 1916 race by a few thousand votes.

Certain reasons exist for believing that the loss of the state might not be fatal to Roosevelt this year—reasons which can be discussed separately.

Two months before election, however, it can be reported that top Republican leaders are fairly sure Governor Landon will take the Empire State with its 47 electoral votes in November and that Democratic leaders are privately admitting that the odds seem slightly against the

president. Whatever happens, there will be a great battle in New York this fall. This is the home of some of the most colorful popular leaders of our time and they will be in it up to the neck—Roosevelt himself, the one and only Al Smith, peppery little Mayor LaGuardia, picturesque ex-Mayor Jimmy Walker, "Big Jim" Farley, Governor Lehman, and many others.

**Upstate Heavily G. O. P.**  
The Republicans expect a plurality of several hundred thousand votes upstate, where farmers—who benefited little from AAA—are heavily anti-New Deal.

As usual in New York elections, the question will be whether the large plurality the Democratic candidate is sure to roll up in New York City is enough to wipe out the adverse vote upstate.

Roosevelt carried the state by 800,000 votes in 1932. Lehman won by 800,000 in 1934. These are large leads for the G. O. P. to wipe out. But it is customary in New York to believe that upstate pluralities cannot be beaten unless Tammany Hall makes a vigorous effort to get out its full vote. This year most of the Tammany leaders are sour on Roosevelt and Farley. Especially on Farley, since they feel he wants to control their organization as part of his national machine.

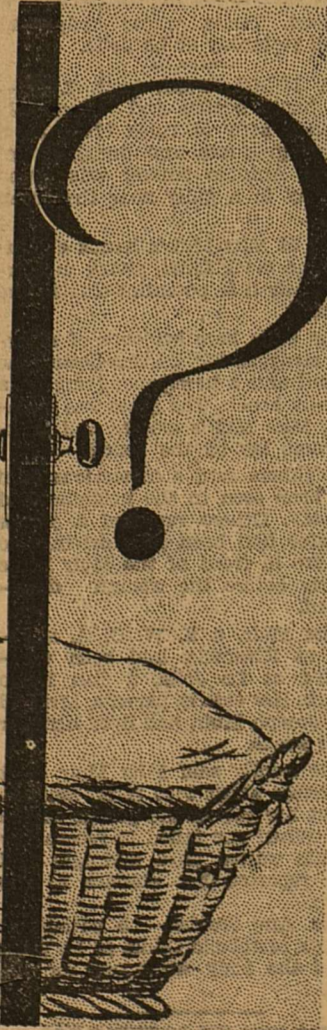

### Train Beauty Kept Up By 'Beauty Parlors'

CHICAGO, Sept. 1.—The biggest busiest beauty parlor in the world is the beauty shops that a streamlined train patronizes during its leisure periods.

How one popular streamliner preserves its shiny nose and otherwise keeps its "tracks appeal" was told today by Harry G. Taylor, Chairman of the Western Association of Railway Executives.

After reaching the end of its daily run and having discharged its passengers, the new train backs out of the terminal station, according to Mr. Taylor's description. Then does the "power car," as the diesel-driven train's equivalent for locomotive is called, go to the roundhouse? Not at all. The whole train, as one unit, goes round by the way of the roundhouse, passes it up smoothly, and proceeds to its own outdoor beauty parlor.

"This is in the form of a 'Y' shaped set of side tracks," said Mr. Taylor. "Once in its berth on one branch of the 'Y,' the train is hand-led as a single unit, the power car not being detached. The whole job is done by a new school of train servicing and calls to its tasks special knowledge along lines which are new to railroading."

"The first thing that is done when the train has reached the 'Y' is to give it a thorough inspection. This is done by the chief inspector and his assistants. From the incoming motorman he receives a report of the train's performance during the day's run. This and the inspector's own report are then turned over to the master mechanic, who is res-

ponsible for keeping the train in the pink of condition.

"Next the chief machinist, and the chief electrician, and their helpers, give the train a thorough going-over, which may last for hours. By means of a concrete drop-pit beneath the tracks, wheels may be changed and other nether treatment applied. If necessary, repairs are made in the motor, generator, air-conditioning equipment and other units so that everything will be ship-shape to the last dot for the next days trip.

"In the meantime, a small army of car cleaners have tackled the train inside and out. This is the real beauty parlor feature of the terminal servicing. By the time the treatment is finished the train is as spick and span as a battleship's 'bright work' in readiness for the admiral's inspection.

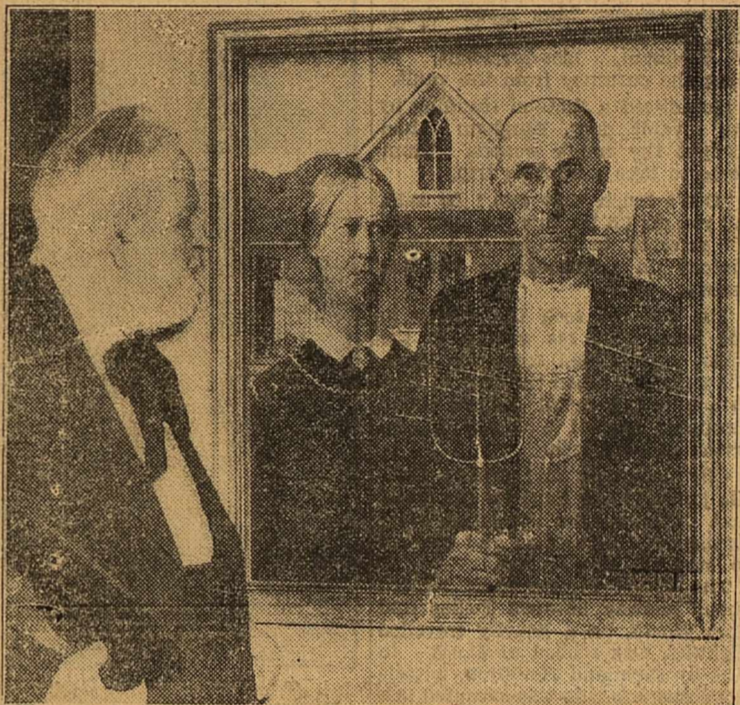
"Another visitor during the streamliners rest period is a store department employee who sees that the train is restocked with all necessary supplies.

"So you see, there are not many idle moments in the day of a stream line train. When not in operation, it is being groomed and polished for the next day's battle against time and distance. Unlike a young woman who powders her pretty nose, a streamliner seems to preserve the morale of itself and crew when its nose is shiny."

### Republicans Face Big Task

LaGuardia will campaign for Roosevelt, according to all reports. So will Jimmy Walker, which should be a help in the city. Organized labor leaders are putting on a hot campaign to get out the vote for Roosevelt.

There's hopeful New Deal talk of 250,000 or more votes for Roosevelt who never took the trouble to vote before. Father Coughlin's remarks concerning Jews helped the national ticket in New York.

**Some Cheer for Democrats**  
Worries of the Democratic high command aren't shared by all, either. Some insist that this election will be out of the politicians' hands, that in the assembly elections of 1935, when Tammany was relatively inactive and Republicans stressed the New Deal issue, the people of the metropolis registered and flocked to the polls in tremendous numbers to vote Democratic.

According to this theory, the "man on the street" is aroused and will come to bat for Roosevelt without being herded to the polls by Tammany. And Tammany has so many important local political contests of its own that it can't afford to "lie down" this year.

It is also true that Democratic political bosses in the boroughs outside Manhattan—Ed Flynn of the Bronx, Jim Sheridan of Queens, and Frank Kelly of Brooklyn—will stand by Roosevelt.

The fight in New York between Landon and Roosevelt may be so close, in fact, that it will be decided by the trends of the next few weeks.

Outlying wildcats reported no interesting developments today. The Yoakum test of Stogner and Roosevelt No. 1 Roosevelt, section 215, block D, John H. Gibson survey, is drilling without change in lime at 5,230 feet.

### In Gaines county, Landreth No. 1
