## Thrills of Deep Sea Diving Told Members Of The Rotary Club

Thrills of deep sea diving and interesting facts about the bottom of Texas lakes and streams were recounted by Nolan Phillips of Waco in a talk at the Rotary club today. Phillips, a certified public accountant who has been here on numerous occasions, is auditing the tax rolls of the Midland independent school district.

At the age if sixteen, Phillips joined the navy and was stationed at Mare Island. On a bet, he took his first deep sea trip, going 130 feet to recover an anchor. That led to his habit of making such dives. and, on his return to Waco, he and his brother-in-law organized a diving company for the purpose of salvaging articles from the Brazos river.

After entering another business, the two men continued diving as a hobby. They now have their telephone numbers and addresses on file with police and sheriffs' offices throughout the state, being ready on call to assist in rescue work recovery of bodies or valuable articles or for inspection of dams. Phillips declared that the bot tom of Dedina lake, near San Antonio, is one of the beauty spots of Texas, with much plant life in evidence. Fish are found as far as seventy feet below the surface there, he said. He also described facts about Cisco and Waco lakes, as well as of fresh water streams.


