W. J. Glenn, confederate veteran,
Indian fighter, and former trail drivIndian fighter, and former trail driv-
er of the early days, passed to his er of the early days, passed to his
reward last Friday after a painful
illness that lasted about two weeks. illness that lasted about two weeks.
He has lived a very interesting
life replete with experiences that only life replete with experiences that only
the pioneers and early citizens of the pioneers and early citizens of
the west have known. The following the west have known. The following
account of his life gives many of its
outstanding points: outstanding ononts.
W. J. Glenn who departed this life
July 31 1925, was born in Cherokee July 31 1925, was born in Cherokee
County, Texas, June 11 1844. He
moved with his parents to Burnet, County, Texas, June
moved with his parents to Burnet,
then to Gillispie County when the
call came for enlisting, he walked call came for enlisting, he walked
from Kerville to San Antonio in one
day to enlist. He served through
the four years war as a confederate the four years war as a confederate
soldier. On his return to Kerville
in 1865, he met and married Miss solaier. On his return to Kerrvilie
in 186, he met and married Miss
Rhoda Lowrance January 1 1866, of which union ten children were born,
all of which are living except Elbert

was an old trail driver, having driv-
