Thomas, who has been ill for several weeks, is up again and was down town the first of the week. | Wingless May Beetles Found On Local Farms $\qquad$ <br> County Agent Snider recently sent specimens of a bug which has been found on local farms to the A. \& M. College, and received a letter this week from R. R. Reppert, entomologist, stating that they are "wingless May Beetles." <br> These bugs develop from the common "grub worm" and are usually found around fields adjacent to pasture land, or in fields which have been abandoned to weeds for a year or two. The bugs will damage cotton if let alone. <br> The entomologist advises poison bran mash as a remedy, and it is pre- | pared in the following way: <br> Wheat bran $\qquad$ <br> White arsenic or paris green. 1 lb . Lemon or Oranges $\quad 6$ fruits Low grade cane or sorghum molasses quarts Water $\qquad$ $\qquad$ 1 gallon <br> Mix the bran and poison thoroughly while dry: Dilute the molasses with the amount of water as named, squeeze the lemon juice into this diluted molasses, then grind the rind of the lemon with a meat chopper and add this also to the liquid. Then mix the liquid thoroughly with the poison bran mixture. After an even mixture has thus been obtained, add more water and mix, until a mash is obtained that when squeezed in the hand readily falls apart. |
