Mention was made a week or two ago that Neal Wickizer had to build some over size shafts for the Hereford bull to use in pulling the cotton planter, in the parade at Wichita Falls, but if the statement made in last week's Stephenville Empire is to be taken literally, the shafts had to accommodate both the bull and its owner, John M. Gist.

W. A. Hyatt detected the statement in his copy of the Empire and referred it to our desk. The part of the story which contains this startling information has reference to the part played in the parade by the Tarleton College band and is as follows:

"They were immediately at the head of the Midland parade stunt, one that attracted great attention and applause all along the line of march. The Midland show consisted of John M. Gist, the widely known Hereford cattleman, walking between the handles of a cottonseed planter drawn by a Hereford bull. On the plater was a miniature oil derrick. The banner read, "These three, oil, cotton and cattle, are working together to build up Midland."

The United tomobile declared Dr. Gustav Egloff, noted petroleum chemist of Chicago, while visiting on the University of Texas campus recently. Dr. Egloff delivered several lectures while at the University on 'various phases of motor fuels. He is director of research of the Universal Oil Products Company of Chicago.

Dr. Egloff explained that the automotive industry has not kept pace with the advanced technique of the oil industry. "Many engineers" he Shower Fell said, "are not alive to the fact that they should build higher compression motors to utilize efficiently the more powerful fuel which has been produed for them."

Pointing out the astounding saving which results from a more equal development of motors and motor fuels, Dr. Egloff continued: "Whereas the average motor fuel of today would function best in a 100-pound or more compressive motor, the average pressure of combustion in motors today is about 80 pounds. If we could use the higher compression motors and obtain the increased mileage of 25 per cent, we would require only approximately 10,000,000,000 gallons of motor fuel this year instead of 12,-000,000,000 gallons. This would mean a saving in our gasoline bill of over \$25,000,000 for the year 1927.

Another phase of the petroleum industry of which Dr. Egloff spoke was that of the production of synthetic commodities such as alcohols, rubber and a host of other substances useful in our economic system. "Once the economic need becomes apparent it may well develop that edible oils or fats will be produced from petroleum,," he said.

#### Can Measure Temperature Of Oil Wells

Austin, Texas, May 21 .- An apparatus for measuring the temperature in oil and gas wells has been made in the machine shops at the University of Texas following designs originated by Dr. Van Orstrand of the United States Geological Survey, according to Dr. E. H. Sellards, associate director of the University Bureau of Economic Geology. The apparatus is adapted to placing thermometers in well and making it possible to take temperatures with great curacy at regular intervals.

"In this way," Dr. Sellards explained, "there is established a gradient of increase of temperature for that particular well. The object for these measurements is to determine the relation of temperature increase to structural features, as it is considered possible that the rate of increase in temperature may be greater on uplifts than elsewhere. These temperature measurements are a part of a research project recommended by the Central Petroleum Committee of the National Research Council. Measurements of this kind are being made in Oklahoma, Texas and Cailfornia The work in this State is being conducted from the University of Tex-



#### Clipping Horses During Spring Quite Important

When horses have been so fed an groomed during the winter that their coats are comparatively short, clip ping is not so essential as when the horses have run out more or less o have wintered on coarse feeds with little work. Horses that have a long heavy hair coat are not in condition to work in that they sweat easily and soon become saturated with perspira tion and they will remain uncomfort able for hours after stopping work and are very likely to take cold or suffer from muscular soreness as a result of this treatment. If the horses are clipped before being put to heavy

#### Treatment for Rupture in Colts Is Outlined

It is not uncommon to see a foal with a ruptured condition of the navel. This is called umbilical hernia and causes grave concern to the owner; but happily it tends gradually to disappear as the foal grows and the abdomen increases in size. In some cases, however, the rupture increases n size and then requires an operation for its removal. To hasten disappearance of a small navel rupture. tincture of iodine may be applied two

or three times a week. Some owners prefer to blister the part with cantharidine ointment of dilute acid, while others contrive a truss of sole leather to press constantly upon the part. For a truss to succeed it should be kept in place with a harness partly made of suspender elastic, so that the breathing motions of the animal will not be impaired.

Rape Good for Sheep

Rape constitutes a very good pasture for sheep. It has good fattening qualities, and is prized for finishing lambs for market. Caution must be exercised in starting sheep on rape. They should be given a partial fill of hay before turning them on it the first time, and it should always be combined with some other pasture if possible. On rainy days and morning when the rape is wet with dew, the sheep should be kept on the pasture. as the wet rape often causes blost.



GASOLINE PLANT

NOW IN OPERATION The big gasoline plant of the Magnolia Petroleum Co. at Otischalf is now operating regularly and turning out about 500 barrels of gasoline daily. This plant has a capacity of 2000 or more barrels of gasoline per

Gasoline is extracted from the gas issuing from the oil wells in the Chalf field. After the gasoline is secured the gas is used to operate the pumping plants in the field and for use in some of the houses in the field. The supply of gas is not yet sufficient to operate the gasoline

plant at full capacity. This plant is a big thing, and the gasoline manufactured is the best to be had. The gasoline as a by-product of the gas and would be lost completely were it not for this plant.

Other commanies having wells showing considerable gas will establish similar plants to turn this waste into money.




