TEACHERS INSTITUTE BEGINS

MONDAY SEPTEMBER SIXTH

The Midland Public Schools will open September 13 according to present plans following the institute which starts September 6. The personnel of the teaching staff has not yet been announced.

Recently the Midland High School received an additional one half unit credit affiliation in home economics with the state university. This makes a total of two and one half units of affiliation after only three years work in the home economics department. Equipment has been somewhat limited heretofore but is expected that this difficulty will be overcome this year.

The new high school building will be open for the first time to students. Complete laboratories, spacious class rooms, a library, and an auditorium are main features of the new build-
