Mayes <br> "Turn Texas Loose" <br> The Southern Pacific Railroad is seeking permission from the Interstate Commerce Commission to extend its line 28 miles to Brownsville, and it is stated that this will be contested strongly by the Missouri Pacific on the ground that the territory is already served by the latter road. In other words, the Misouri Pacific claims that it got there first and therefore the country it traverses belongs to it insofar as railroad transportation is concerned. The interest of the people is of but little concern, the railroads must be protected against each other, according to the policies of our government. In numerous other sections, especially in the rapidly developing Panhandle of Texas, railroad building is being held back and the development of the country is being retarded because of this idea that the railroads must not with each other in a way that they may lose money. What Texas needs is to have the governmental red tape removed and railroads built, even if the roads should lose money occasionally through competition. Texas is losing more through lack of development than the roads will ever lose through business rivalry. <br> Cotton Rushed To Market <br> Reports are that cotton growers and their mercantile and banking creditors are panicky and are forcing cotton on the market to such an extent that the price is being kept down in spite of all the efforts to retard marketing until the price is again up. There has been delay in getting the holding and crop reduction movement under way, and in the meantime there has been manifested a disposition to sell at whatever the crop will bring. $I_{t}$ is unfortunate that many farmers either will not or can not enter into agreements that will insure systematic marketing and reasonable acreage plantings.
