#### BUSINESS CONDITIONS FAVORABLE

Those who have been expecting a boom in Midland this fall are probably due for disappointment. From all indications, unless new oil development in Andrews county or other wildcat territory is found, there is nothing to create a boom in and around Midland at present.

But who wants a boom? No one profits greatly from a boom except the speculator; and those who have their property values boomed above normal prices, if they sell, usually invest in something else of boom price.

Oil development, although quiet through the summer, is in its beginning stages in West Texas, and a good ten years will be consumed in developing the proven territory. Oil men everywhere believe that the bulk of the Permian Basin producing territory is yet undiscovered.

Range conditions are now safe. Cattle, although in good flesh throughout the summer, faced drouth conditions up to this week, but are now assured winter grass, as general rains have fallen over the West Texas cattle country, and there is yet time for enough warm weather to provide a good growing season.

Crops in West Texas are better than in other parts of the state, according to a survey made by experts, because, although there was a dry season from the middle to the late part of the season, rains fell soon enough to hold feed crops. Other parts of the state have less optimistic crop outlooks, the survey shows.

The International Union Sunday School Lesson for September 15. The Call for Trained Teachers. Neh. 8:1-3, 5, 6, 8-12.

This lesson records one of the most unusual and idealistic occurrences in history - the people gathered together "as one man" for instruction in the principles under lying their social foundation and in the great truths related to their daily life together.

Ezra, whose advent to religious leadership in Israel was described in the lesson of Sept. 1, strangely disappears from religious and historic records for a period of from 12 to 14 years, until the events described in the present lesson. Just where Ezra was during that period or what he had been doing is a matter of

### PARIS CENSORS WITHDRAW TWO STAGE DRAMAS

By RICHARD D. MeMILLAN, United Press Staff Correspondent.

PARIS, Sept. 13.—(UP)—The dramatic authors after working for months on a couple of plays of the savory order, as the French call them, have had the shock of their lives by finding that the city which is supposed to tolerate anything and everything in wickedness has baned their productions.

By order of the Police Prefect neither production will be performed, since both go a bit too far in indelicacy, even for Paris.

These latest edicts are part of a campaign which is being waged against certain types of pornography both plays allegedly deal with perversion-but this is the first occasion in decades, if not in living memory, that a production has been banished from the French boards on moral grounds thus constituting a warning to dramatic authors who think they can bring any kind of material to the boards.

Rowdy Audiences

But it must not be imagined because of the Prefect's ban that thoroughly naughty plays are being barred from the theaters here. No, the bedroom comedies are running as usual without hindrance just to prove that Paris has not turned prude.

The two forbidden plays are described by the critics as depicting a trifle too faithfully the habits of certain elements in society, dealing with the themes from the psychological standpoint. They are declared to be exceedingly clever dramatic






