The auditor's report classifies 237 counties, segregating 17 counties because they represented unusual conditions. For example, Hidalgo county's indebtedness per hundred dollars of assessed valuation was \$66. In Loving county it was only 68 cents on the hundred. The average of the classified counties was \$14.70. In Cameron county the tax collection per hundred dollars valuation was \$6.05 and but 69 cents in Loving county, whereas the average county had a tax collection of \$3.49.

BERLIN, August 1. (UP)-An unofficial report said that 26 were dead and more than 200 wounded in street fightnig as returns arrived from yes-

Reports, arriving slowly, indicated that the deaths were due to approximately 35 Hitlerites who were chagrined at the result of the voting and who proposed through a newspaper that the returns be revised by suppressing the communist vote, thereby invalidating 89 communist seats and giving the fascists a clear majority.
