Decks of cards went as favors to the high scorer, Mrs. A. L. Ackers and the high cut, Mrs. M. R. Jackson.

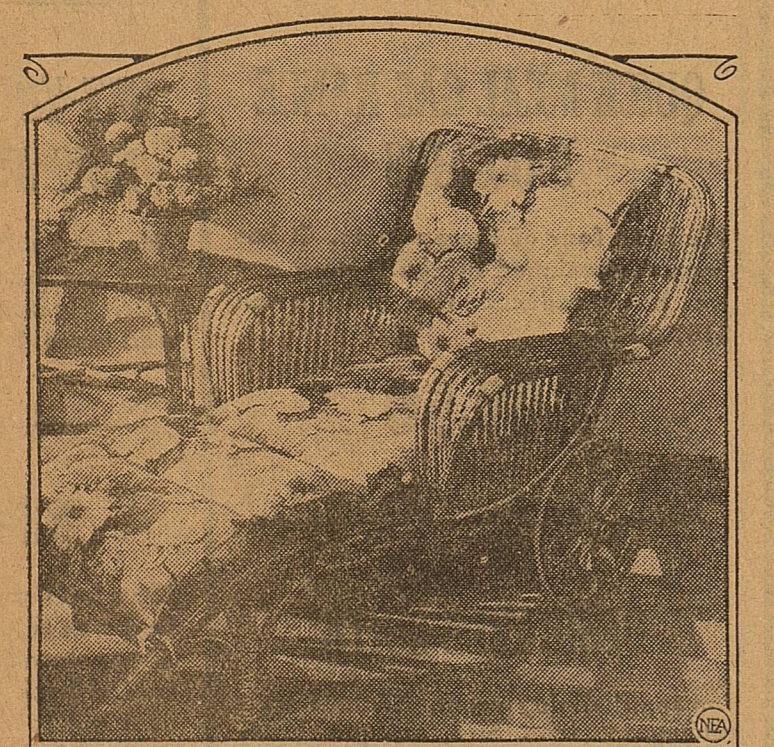

Place in baking dish, sprinkle with cracker crumbs and bits of butter; bake until brown. Serve hot. Add chili pepper if desired.

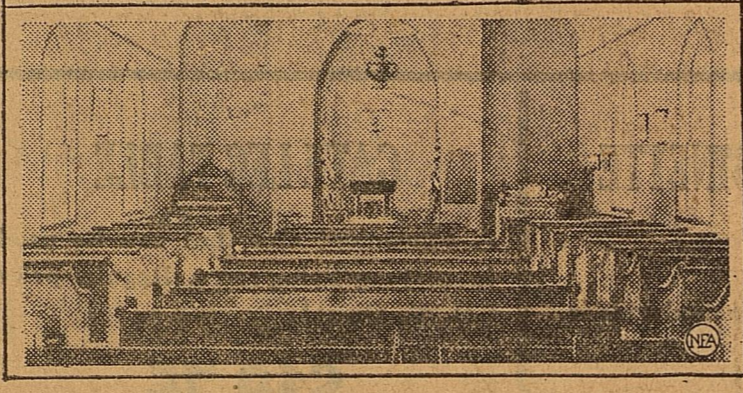
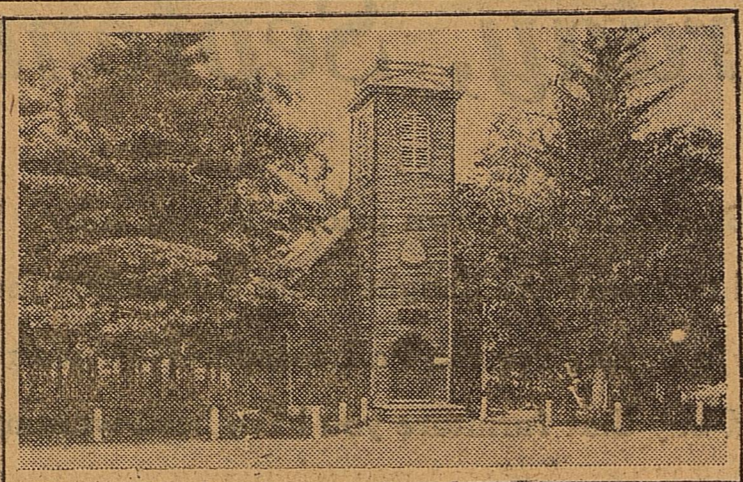
Tamaia Pie Three cups of boiling water and salt to taste one cup corn meal, gradually stir meal into boiling water and cook 30 minutes. Fry one half lb. of steak and chip fins (or use one cup of cold chopped meat), one onion minced, one can tomatoes, one or two green sweet peppers, one table-spoon of chili powder and salt to taste. Famous Churches SONG BRINGS FAME TO LITTLE BROWN CHURCH No. 1 of a Series

"There's a church in the valley by the wildwood, No lovelier spot in the dale— No place is so dear to my childhood As the Little Brown Church in the Vale."

Thus goes the sweet, old song that has made the "Little Brown Church in the Vale," located in northeastern Iowa in the beautiful Cedar river valley, one of the most famous places of worship in the world. A small, weather-beaten structure, painted a dull brown, with its stubby, square belfry half hidden by a cluster of oaks and pines, the church still looks as it did when it was dedicated in 1864 by the struggling congregation of pioneers who had contributed the lumber, logs and stone.

But today the church is a shrine, visited yearly by thousands who are lured by the song which the tiny church inspired Dr. William S. Pitts, a physician, to write more than a half century ago.

The words were first sung by Dr. Pitts before his weekly singing class in 1864. The meeting house, 24 by 32 feet in size, was then known as the "Congregational Church of Bradford," but the name was changed to "The Little Brown Church in the Vale," as the tune became popular. The first pastor was Rev. John K. Nutting, whose salary was paid in farm products. Bradford, then a thriving settlement, has since passed away and the nearest town is Nashua, a few miles distant.

Moved by the song's reaction on the little group at Bradford, Dr. Pitts took it to a Chicago publisher, who promptly bought it. Soon it was being sung at the ends of the earth. It has been translated into several foreign languages and often is broadcast by radio.

Upwards of 50,000 persons visit the church annually and it has become one of Cupid's favorites, some 500 couples being married there each year. Marriage fees go to pay for the upkeep of the church.
