RECOGNIZING STATES' RIGHT Twice within the week at Washington has that ancient
and honorable, though sadly neglected, doctrine of States'
rights received invigorating new recognition. When the rights received invigorating new recognition. When the property laws which divide income and property acquired is, set a new precedent of compelling the Federal gov-
ernment to respect State laws. And when President Hoo ver declared the Federal governnment would not assume
the task of cleaning up Chicago's gangland, declaring it was the function of the State to suppress crime, he like-
wise espoused the principle of the rights of the States to order their own affairs. The President made it clear h
believed it would be an unwarranted intrusion upon the
domain of the States for sume leadership in a war on offenders against State law̄s Athe high importance of the States living up to their re duty of the State than the right of emphasized more State. And he pu his finger on the key to the solution of the crime problem When he urged the great mass of decent citizenry of th criminal laws. In every plea for state's rights, ther
should be incorporated a plea for the performance o
State's duties. The two are bound together closely. Mos of the rights that have been lost disappeared because DEBATING THE TARIFF
The debate over the tariff is apparently endless.
On one side are the high-protection zealots, who ad-
vocate tariff walls that will keep almost all foreign prod-
ucts out of the American markete. On the other side are
the "free-traders," who advocate a prompt leveling of all
duties to allow foreign and domestic producers to com-
pete here and abroad.
The trouble with the latter viewpoint is that it over-
looks the vast difference between American wages and
living standards and those in foreign countries. The trou-
ble with the former is that, once the principle was adopted,
the buying public would be forced, in many instances, to
pay an exorbitant price for commodities, and interchange
of products between nations would suffer a death blow.
Wisdom dictates a middle course. By all means pro-
otect American workers and industries. But, at the same
time, we must remember that now, more than ever before,
toreign trade is vital to prosperity.
