WASHINGTON, Feb. 2. (UP). — The Navy department announced today that the court martial for Major General Smedley Butler had been called for February 16, in Philadelphia.

The court martial of Gen. Butler has aroused more interest in the United States than any foreign reations matter of years. Never, since the days when this country was young, has the nation given an apolgy on a matter of less importance, t is pointed out by Senator Heflin of Alabama than that which followed Gen.
