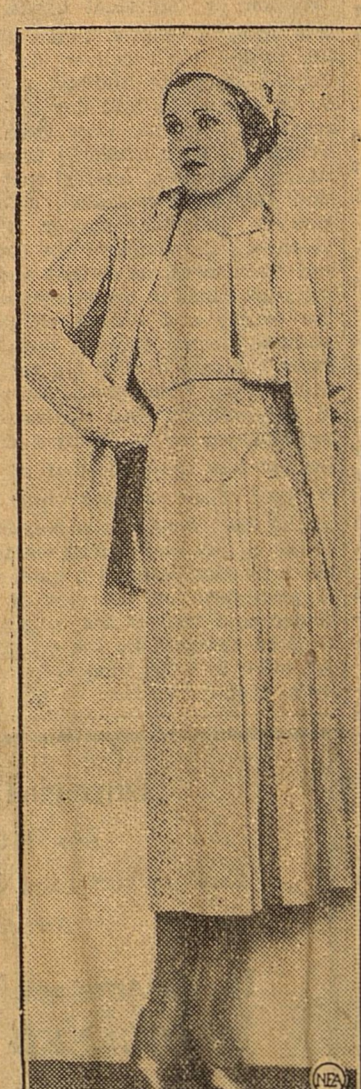

Choice Cooks' Corner

- Lace Wafers (For storage until needed.) 1 cup brown sugar 2 cups dark corn syrup 3-4 cup shortening 1 tsp. ginger 1 tsp. salt 4 cups pastry flour or 3 cups bread flour and 1-4 cup cornstarch 1 cup seeded raisins 2 tps. baking powder Put cooking oil, sugar, syrup, ginger and salt into saucpan together. Stir mixture until it boils; then boil five minutes. Pour into bowl and stir in flour, soda and baking powder sifted together until just stiff enough to drop from a spoon. Add raisins and drop by spoonfuls on to oiled baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven, 375 degrees F., eight to ten minutes. Store in tin box.
