

SLAYER'S EXTRADITION SOUGHT

Man Feeds Poison to 18-Months-Old Baby Then Suicides

MARITAL TROUBLE BLAMED

Wife Threatened but Saves Herself By Flight

DALLAS, April 25. (P) — Thomas J. Cook, 25, railway brakeman of Marshall, poisoned his 18-month-old son, Thomas Lee, and himself at the home of his estranged wife here, both dying at the same hospital soon afterward.

Mrs. Cook said she came home from business school to find Cook on the porch of her home, with poison in one hand and a glass of water in the other, saying he would kill her and himself.

Cook broke into the house where her sister also lived, fed poison to the baby, drank the rest himself and left.

He was found dying a few minutes later. A coroner returned a verdict of slaying and suicide.

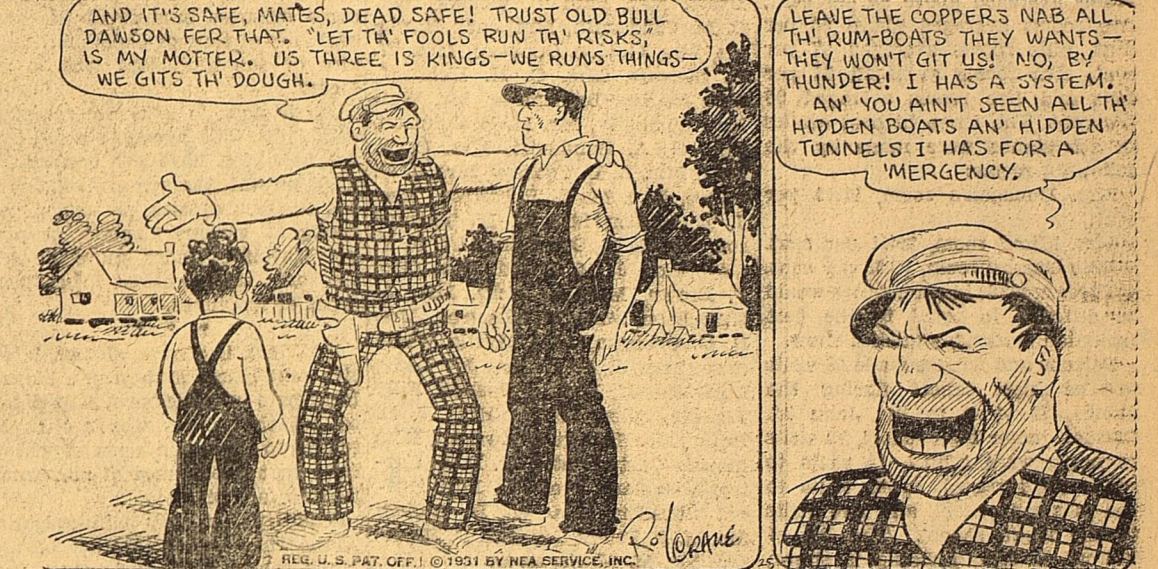
