TRIANGLE FORMS IN BIG ROW

Governor Long Keeps in Mansion, with Guards Posted

BATON ROUGE, Oct. 15. (UP)—Louisiana today had three "governors" as follows: Huey P. Long, elected governor, then elected United States senator; Paul Cyr, lieutenant governor on the ticket with Long, and made governor by declaration because Long had been elected senator; and Walter L. Aldrich, Shreveport, unemployed bill collector who took the oath of office because he considered the office abandoned.

Long and his family still occupied the governor's mansion with armed guards outside.

Political Affairs Of State Involved

BATON ROUGE, La., Oct. 15. (UP)—A free-for-all fight for the governorship of Louisiana is in progress, with three men, one an obscure private citizen, claiming the office.

Staleness Guarded

"The fight centered about this city and armed state highway policemen stood guard about the executive mansion and the statehouse at intervals during the day. Huey P. Long, governor for the last two years, held the advantage, by right of possession, Paul N. Cyr, lieutenant governor until he forfeited his job Tuesday by taking the oath of office as governor, disputed the office. A plain citizen, Walter L. Aldrich, Shreveport, claimed the office was "abandoned property."

To Give Instructions

"I will instruct my various departments of state and the employees of my policies in a few days," he said in an announcement.

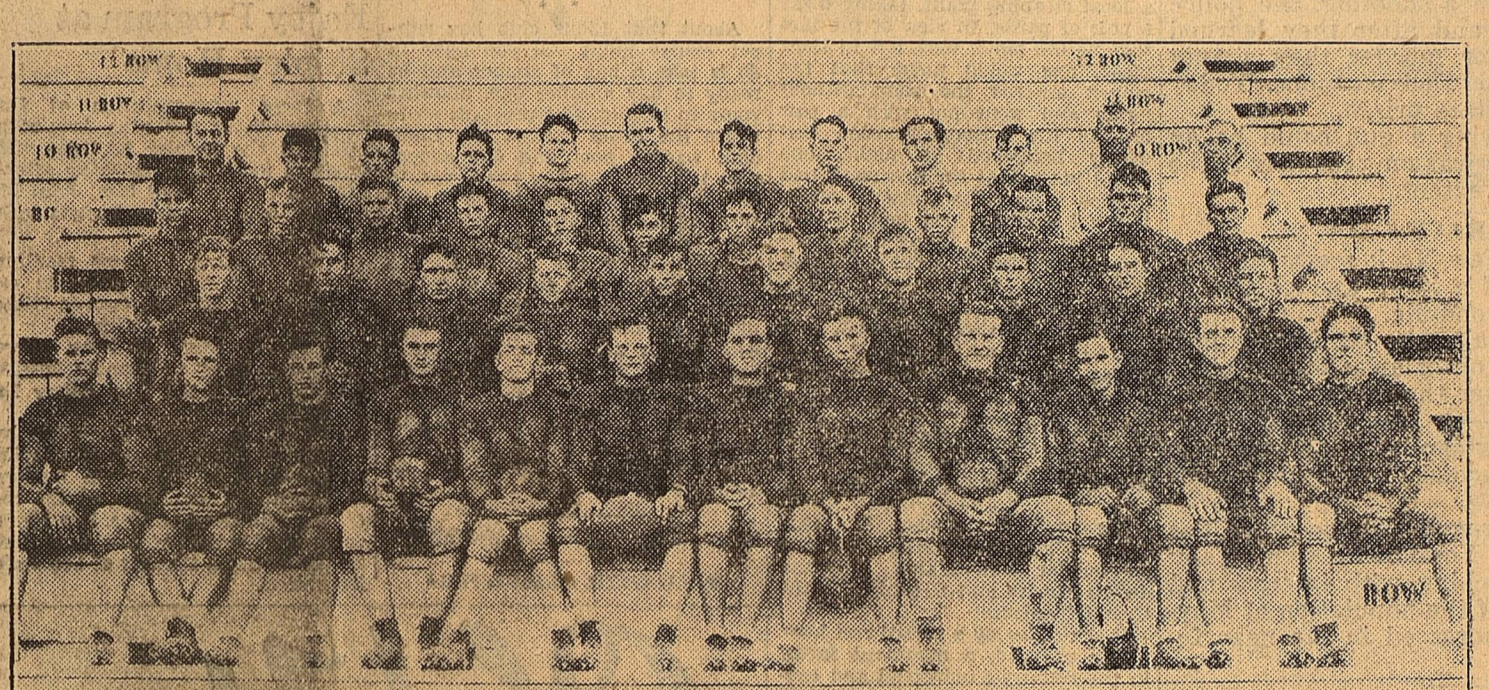
