Evidently, the day of "one-m

over congress swept awwy by an ad-

pit him to maintain the pet,

We are reminded once more- that

has a hard time of it. It almost converts one to the belief that the term

the experiences of President Wilson and ex-President Taft that after all
the supreme power in the governthe supreme power in the govern-

blance of "one-man government" in
the present situation. the present situation.
The Undereloped Water Powers
