

STOCKS, COMMODITIES RECOVER

Second Producer in New Ector County Field Flowing

ELLIOTT COWDEN WELL ATTRACTING MUCH ATTENTION

Test of the Well Is Expected This Afternoon

Starting to flow at 10 o'clock this morning, Stanolind Oil and Gas company's No. 1 Elliott F. Cowden, Ector county test in section 26, block 43, township 2 south, had become the center of West Texas oil interest and was attracting great crowds to the location, five miles west of Odessa.

Oil and gas started showing Thursday, the gas showing through the drilling fluid when swabbing was resumed at 1,400 feet and oil when the column had been lowered 2,200 feet.

Test of the well was expected to be made this afternoon. The Midland office of Stanolind had no definite information to report as to amount of flows made this morning.

Stanolind No. 1 Cowden is 1,320 feet from the west line and 330 from the south line of section 26 and is a north offset to L. C. Harrison et al. No. 1 Addis, the discovery well in Ector county's latest and third pool, about five miles west of Odessa.

The well had its best saturated lime from 3,920 to 3,930 feet, but cores recovered at various intervals from as high as 3,820 feet contained oil showings.

In the northern part of Ector county Landreth Production company and the Texas Company No. 1 Holt, 2,025 feet from the east line and 660 from the south line of section 16, block 43, township 1 north, on E. B. Railway survey, is temporarily delayed at 1,495 feet, where casing was being set Thursday. The test is not due to reach the anhydrite series above 1,600 feet.

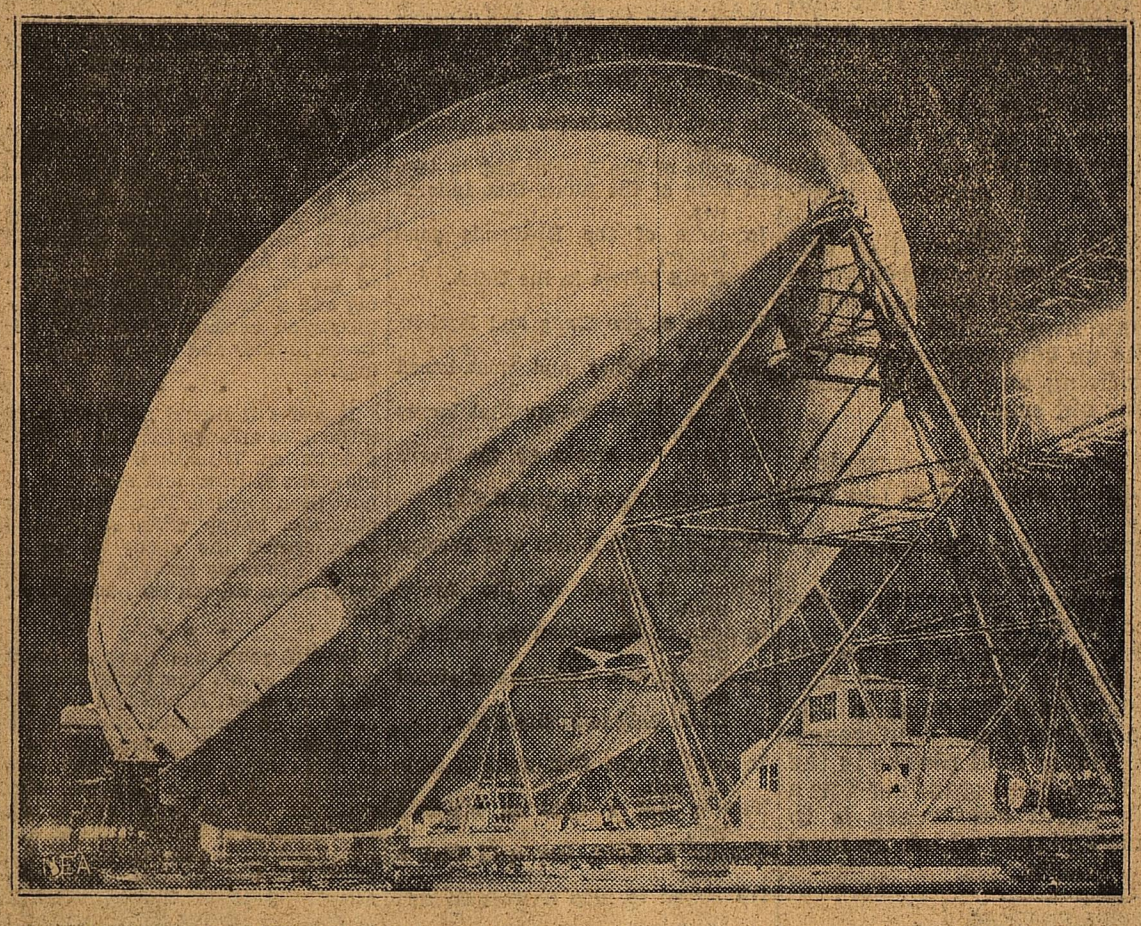
BRISK TEMPERATURES CONTINUE; 35 HERE

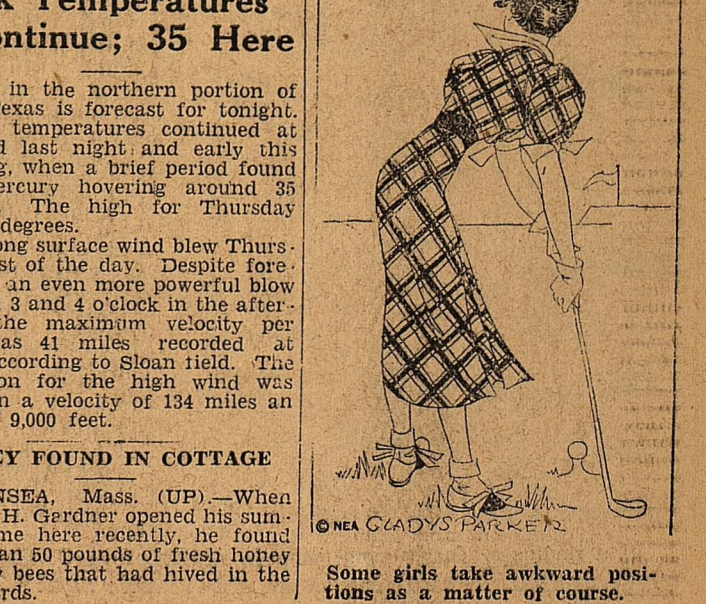

ROOSEVELT LEADS THE WORLD

Most Americans, probably, get a thrill of pride out of the fact that their president is trying to lead the world back to prosperity. To have an American president inviting the rulers of nearly a score of nations to confer with him and with each other about ways of restoring good times, to know that the hopes of the world once more are centered about the White House—all of this is very gratifying to our self-esteem.

What we don't so quickly recognize is the fact that a very heavy weight of responsibility rests upon us, as individual citizens, in connection with this venture.

It is hardly going too far to say that one of the biggest obstacles in President Roosevelt's way as he moves toward this world economic conference, is made up of the prejudices, the misconceptions and the mistaken judgments of his own fellow citizens.

You can't get any where with a conference of this kind without being ready to make some sacrifices yourself. That goes without saying. But there has developed in this country since the war an iron-headed obstinacy quick to assert that we can make no concessions, that the other side must do all the sacrificing and that we need not and must not relax any of our old creeds.

This finds expression in various ways. For example: There must be no cancellation of any part of the war debts.

We must not make any agreement under which we shall buy any goods of foreign manufacture.

We cannot bind ourselves to co-operate with European nations for more than two weeks at a time.

All American diplomats are helpless and innocent babes and all European diplomats are cunning and conscienceless schemers, so that Uncle Sam is bound to lose his shirt every time he sits in on international conference.

Those are some of the most widely held planks in the platform on which some of us have been standing for a good many years. And if this world conference is to amount to anything at all, those are planks which we must be prepared to discard.

HEALTH AND DEPRESSION

If you doubt that the scanty fare and poor living conditions caused by extreme poverty have undermined the health of poverty's victims, you might ponder over remarks made by Col. James P. Barney of the U. S. army after he had inspected the first group of 320 Conservation-Corps recruits at Fort Knox, Ky.

Looking over the under-fed young chaps in the detachment, Colonel Barney brooded:

"They tell me I've got a couple of weeks to train these boys before they're assigned to some forest project, but two weeks isn't enough. It ought to be at least a month before they are fed enough and get their muscles used to work."

That blunt comment speaks volumes about the price which young bodies have been paying for the depression.

Mexico City says the first highway through from the Texas border will be completely rainproofed before the Mexican rains begin in June. The road will still be narrow, rough and hazardous in places, but a good motorist can negotiate it, and it is the certain promise of a better era ahead—when a run to Mexico City and an understanding of the Mexican people will be commonplaces among traveling Americans.

Californians have their own cool way of speaking of earthquakes such as the one that recently visited the Los Angeles area: nobody would have missed it for a million dollars—or give a nickel to go through another.

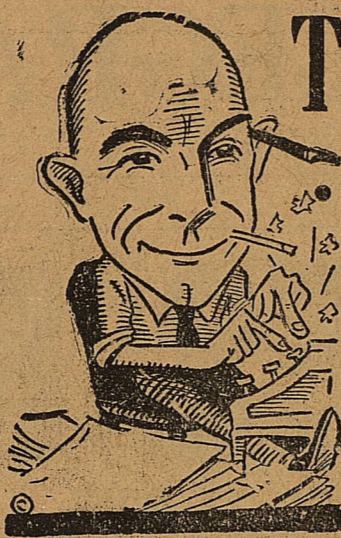

Russians Try High Ural Range Peak

SVERDLOVSK, U. S. S. R. (UP) An expedition of Alpinists has set out for the dangerous undertaking of scaling for the first time in history the highest Ural mountains peak, Point Tel-Pos-Is.

The peak is located in the polar reaches of the Ural range and its character may be judged from its name, which in the native Zhirany long means "nest of storms." Considered sacred by the Eskimos of the region, Tel-Pos-Is never has been conquered by explorers. The only expedition on record was 1847 under German leadership, and ended in failure.

Beat egg whites until they stand up in peaks. Add sugar slowly, two tablespoons at a time. Add vanilla and vinegar and fold in crumbled cookies. Turn into buttered, loose bottomed cake pan and bake in a slow oven (300° F.) 50-60 minutes. Serve covered with canned fruit or whipped cream.

Biologist Derides Birth Control Idea

NOTRE DAME, Ind. (UP)—The call for "fewer and better babies," by birth control advocates was derided by Dr. Regidius Kaczmarek, Notre Dame university biologist, in an address here.

"To cringe at the word 'reproduction' is prudery of the highest type," he said. "Nothing gives as much happiness, health and longevity to a married woman as the bringing forth of children. Life is a rhythmic cycle and reproduction is the phase of it," he declared.
