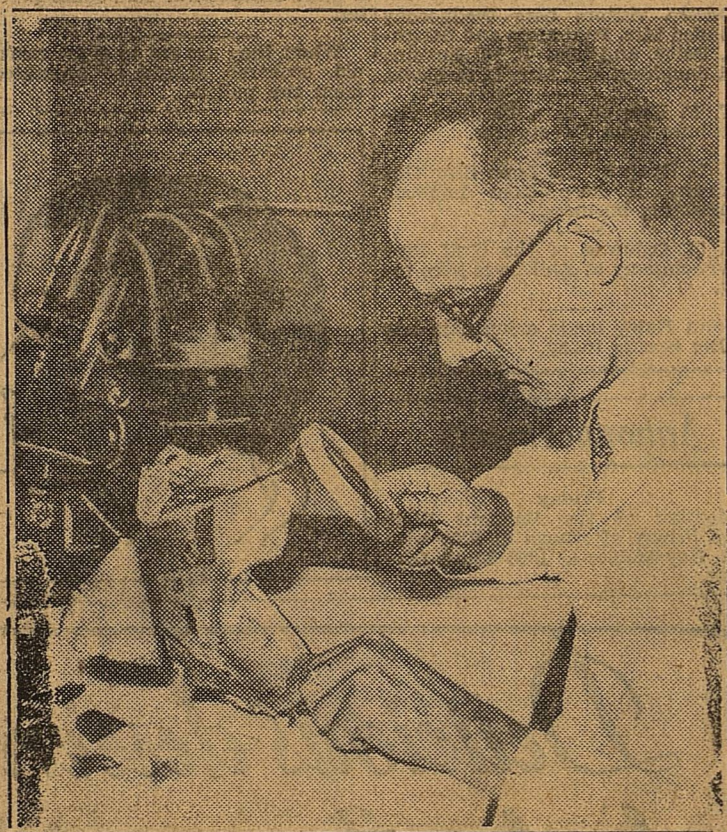

Nearly 30,000 miles of state highways were completed last year in the United States. And while not at all doubtful of the fact, many a persons would like to see them for himself.

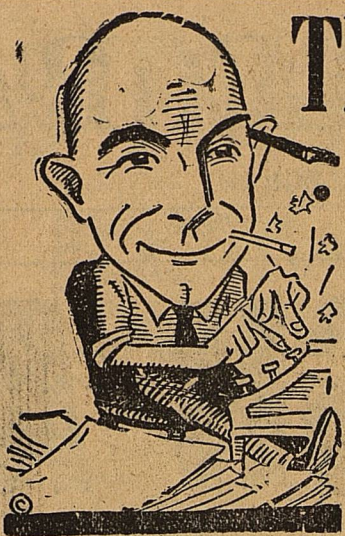
