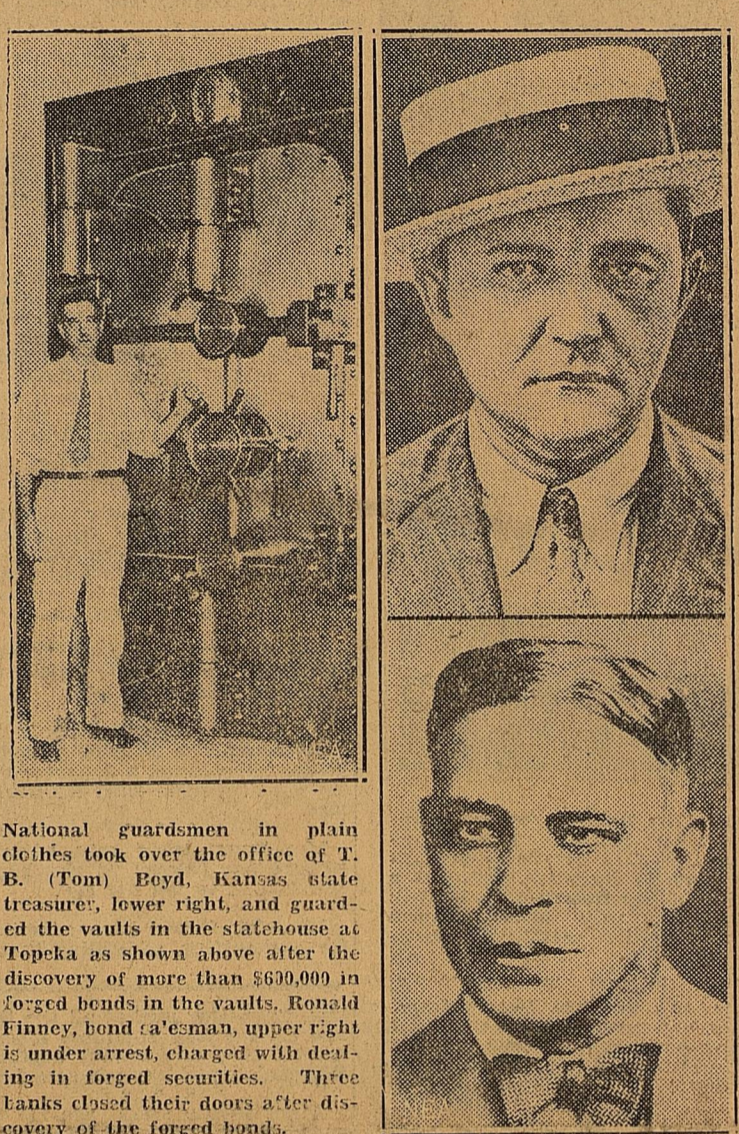

Guard Vaults After Bond Swindle

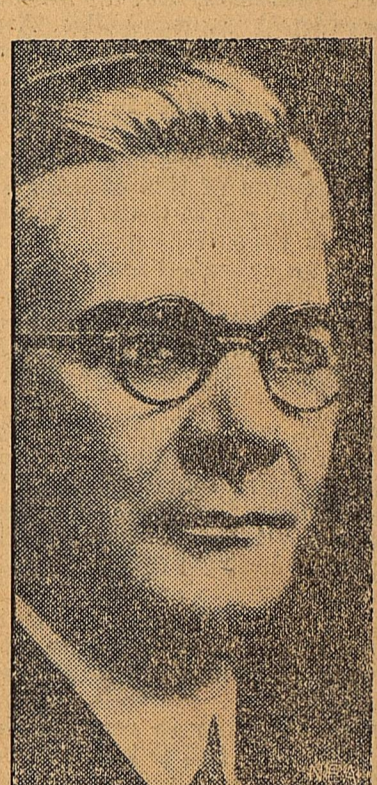

Russians Attack Newspaper Article

MOSCOW. (UP)—The forebearers of Leslie C. Thornton, the British engineer recently released from a Soviet prison on espionage and sabotage charges, are the objects of a bitter attack in the newspaper Evening Moscow here.

As is generally known, Thornton's uncle and his own father were in the textile manufacturing business in St. Petersburg before the revolution, and he was himself born in Russia. An article in the Evening Moscow accused the Thornton family of pitiless exploitation of peasant workers child labor and harsh measures against their employes.

Near Beer Is Taxed in Idaho

BOISE, Idaho. (UP)—Even near beer, regardless of alcoholic content, is taxed in Idaho. The same levy is required on near beer as the newly legalized 3.2 per cent brew.

Retail dealers also are required to pay the same license fee of \$1 yearly to the state and not more than \$12.50 to the county and city. Attorney General Bert Miller opined.
