DETROIT.—There was little question but that the St. Louis Cardinals were the strongest club in baseball at the finish of the 1934 penmant races.

The eleventh-hour drive of the courageous and colorful Cardinals captivated the nation—made them the most magnetic attraction in the business. In their last visit in Boston, the world champion Giants were booed, while the good people of the Hub cheered wildly whenever the St. Louis outfit decorated the score-board. The world is with the underdog, and the story of the 1934 Red Birds reads like fiction.

It was one of the most spectacular thrusts in the history of the game that created the most savage ly-fought windup since the Cubstited the Giants in 1908, and won the replayed game made necessary by Fred Merkle's historic "boner."

Going east after Labor day seven games behind, the Cardinals kept pecking away at the Giants' lead until they had the world champions jittery—unable to hit and fielding like a troupe of awkward jugglers.
