Here, surely, is a point for patriots to remember. A land that cannot provide good sliced tomatoes and sweet corn must, by that very fact, be a pretty second-rate sort of place.

Men's Class Is Host to The Naomi

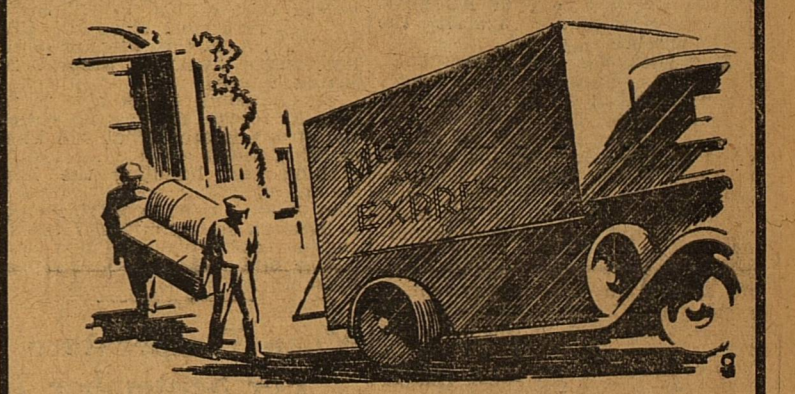

### OIL NOTES

One bailer of sulphur water per hour was encountered in the Brodbeck & Calvert No. 1 Homer National Bank, Upton county test, and preparations are being made to plug and abandon. Total depth is 4223 feet in lime. No more shows or increases were reported after the one-half bailer of oil per hour from 4495 feet. Location is in section 22, block 43, township 4 south, T. & P. survey.

Drilling has been resumed on the Bond et al No. 1 McCarty in section 29, block 3, public school land survey, Andrews county. Pipe was run to the bottom of the hole at 1573 feet.

Mr. and Mrs. J. Ben Carsey of McCamey are the parents of a baby daughter, Carsey is district geologist for the Humble company at McCamey.

In Winkler county, Sid Richardson No. 1 Hill, in section 18, block B-11, public school land survey, is drilling hard limestone below 2893 feet. The No. 1 Hill is located a couple of miles to the east of the Skelly No. 1 Halley, recent discov-

ery, which at present is cleaning out cavings at about 75 feet off bottom. Pipe lines have been installed, and it will be placed on production as soon as cleaning out is finished.

A rainbow showing of oil was reported at around 2740 feet in the Sayre No. 1 Howe, Winkler county wildcat in section 12, block 26, public school land survey. At last reports the well was drilling below 2755 feet.

Drilling-by is in progress in the Honolulu No. 1 Parker, Andrews county wildcat, which had tools jammed in the hole at 4487 feet. Last night, tools had made about 6 feet past the top of the stuck drillstem. The No. 1 Parker is in section 7, block A-44, public school land survey.

### Turk Is Saved By Red Tape

ISTANBUL, Turkey. (U.P.)—Owing to "Red Tape" Osman Effendi, murderer of his sweetheart, is enjoying a respite which may last for weeks and months. Because authorities in Istanbul and Inebolu cannot agree as to which of the two administrations is to advance the \$12 for his transportation to Istanbul, where the murder was committed, Osman is benefiting.

The head of Inebolu police maintains that he has no fund for such unforeseen cases and that he, therefore, is unable to advance the sum unless specifically authorized by the Ministry of Interior.

On the other hand Istanbul authorities claim that legal obstacles forbid the remitting of the necessary sum to Inebolu. Osman had, ten days ago, gruesomely butchered Nazmie Hanum, in a suburb of Istanbul and had hidden the body under the floor of their room.

Before fleeing to Anatolia he covered the body with many pounds of sliced garlic in the hope that its odor would conceal the crime.

The body was found two days later and Osman was arrested when he debarked at Inebolu.

### Turkish Towns Give Airplanes

ISTANBUL (U.P.)—Wings for the Turkish fatherland are being provided in a unique manner. The non-Turk communities have decided to show their devotion to the Kemalist homeland by donating airplanes to the nation's air force.

An Armenian committee has been formed to collect subscriptions. The first Armenian-given airplane, which goes into the sky, will mark the difference between the Turkey of today and the Turkey of the Armenian deportations. It will be a signal of the era of reconciliation.

The Jews are another large non-Turkish community which has resolved to help air defense in the same way. They think that this will assist in dissipating the Turkish complaint that they are not properly assimilated to Turkish culture and live a life apart, which

### INGLORIOUS NY OUT OF PICTURE

NEW YORK, Oct. 1 (U.P.)—The inglorious debacle of the 1934 Giants passed into baseball history along with the National League season Sunday as the enraged Brooklyn Dodgers did it again, this time 8 to 5, and completed the task of vengeance they set for themselves—the boosting of the St. Louis Cardinals right into the World Series with Detroit.

They did it again, these fantastic down-trodden, ball-playing demons from the other side of the East River, hammering home the answer to Bill Terry's now famous query—"Brooklyn? Are they still in the league?" It didn't matter much that St. Louis, clubbing the Reds again 9 to 0 while the Dean boys held their arms, needed no assistance closing out the campaign, and the greatest closing surge in baseball history, by the safe margin of a two-game lead.

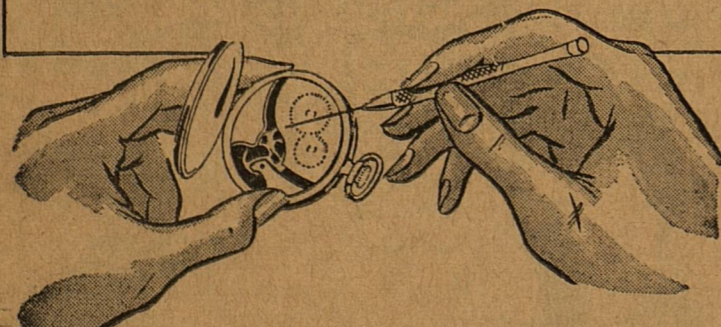
Game From Berlin Faced with a four-run deficit at the start, due to the Giants' gangling, on Ray Beige for four hits and a couple of bases on balls, the Dodgers, playing like world champions themselves, ran right through the shattered titleholders and their all-star staff of Fred Fitzsimmons, Hal Schumacher and Carl Hubbert to win a delicious ball game, finally with a three-run rally off the great southpaw in the tenth.

But long before that, though they never gave up, the Giants knew they were through. Inning by inning the score board showed the Cardinals piling up runs on the Reds, and for the Giants to tie and force the first playoff series in major league history, the Reds had to win.

Fitzsimmons, in trouble often through the 7 1-3 innings he pitched, had blown up finally in the eighth with the score still 5 and 4 in the Giants' favor, the margin being Freddy's personal home run in the fourth off young "Dutch" Leonard, a splendid relief after Beige departed. Hal Schumacher, Prince Hal the Saviour, was warming up and Bill Terry and Blondy "Slogan" Ryan, the great conferrer of the 1933 World Series triumph over the Senators, were talking it over in the box.

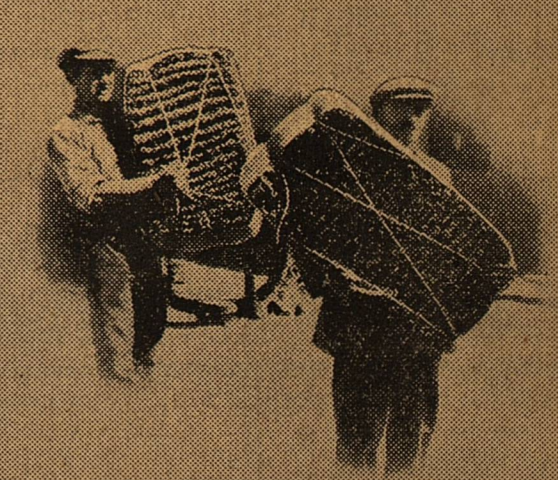

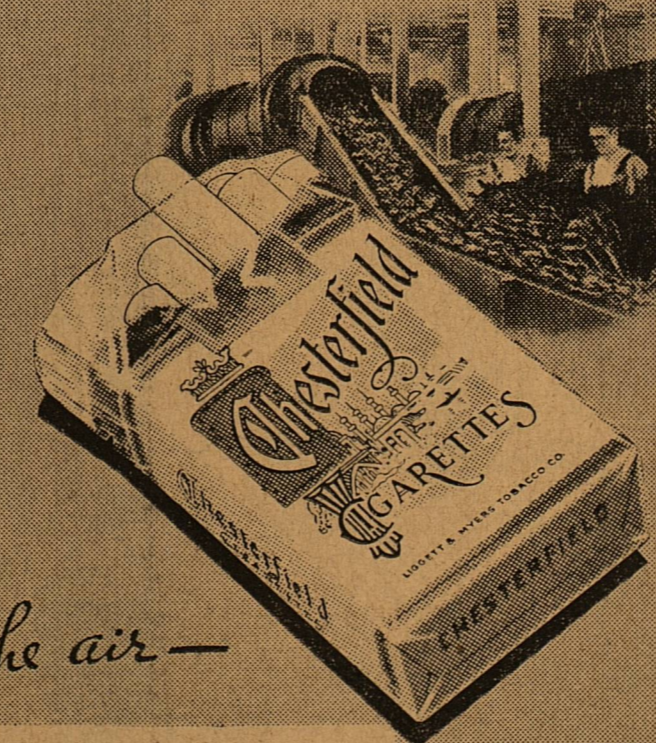
