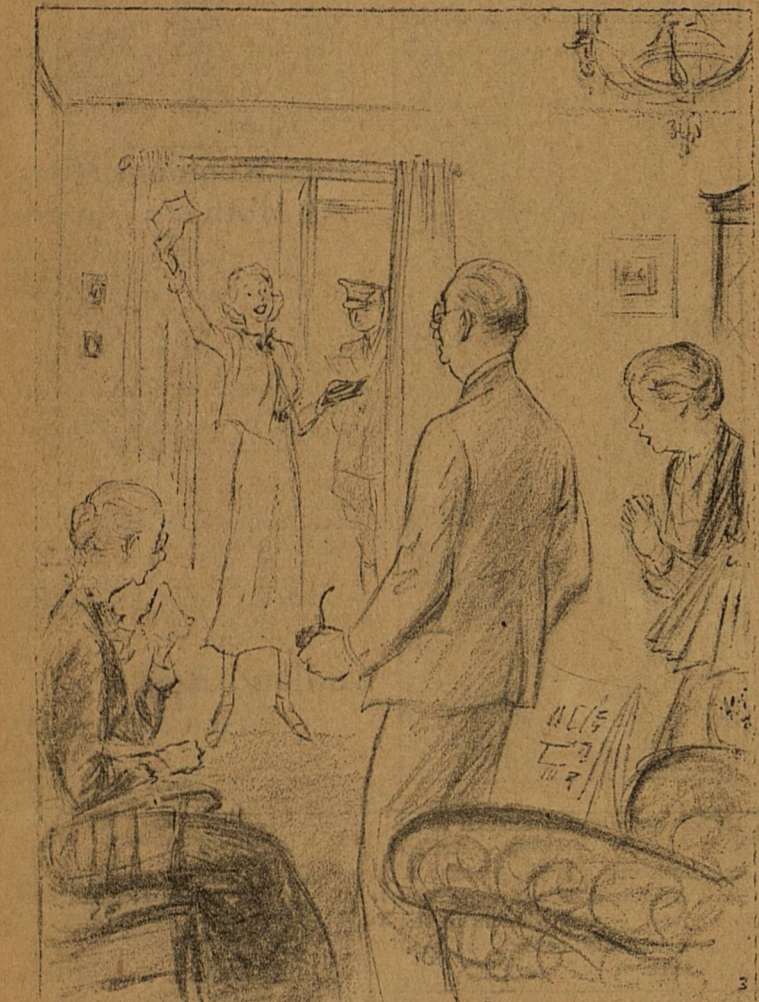
UGLY WARFARE

One of the ugliest little labor disputes this country has had all year seems to be the one which centers in the onion fields of Hardin county, Ohio. There has been long-continued violence, and much bitterness; and the latest development is the voting of an indictment, which charges pointing firearms and assault with intent to kill, against Okey Odell, leader of the strikers.

Previously, a band of 30 or 40 "vigilantes" had kidnaped Odell, taken him to an isolated spot, beaten him, and warned him never to come back to the strike scene. Odell armed himself and came back; the indictment is the latest move.

All of this is an obvious reflection of a situation in which anger and defiance have gone to undue lengths. Federal conciliators have made unsuccessful attempts to set things straight. It looks as if they ought to make another effort. The "onion war," though small, is taking an ugly turn.
