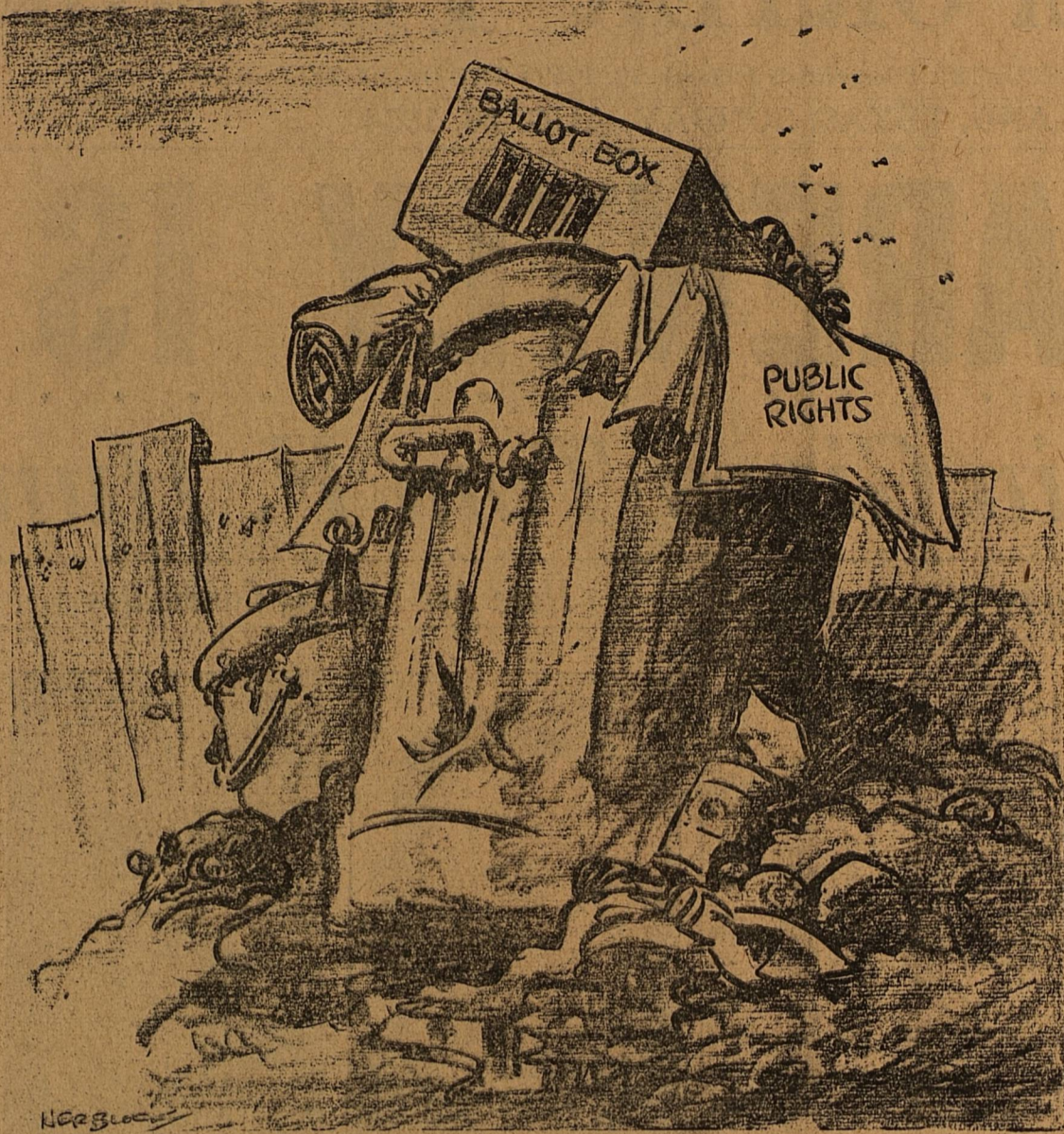
The big need of the day is to get all hands squared away and headed toward some clearly defined goal.

Chapter II "How dare you ask ten thousand ducats for your Perseus! The Prince of Florence raged. Cities and great palaces are built with ten thousand ducats."

Benvenuto Cellini's dagger was in his teeth when his hands were busy with chisel and hammer. As an artist he was the most mature man that ever lived. As a man he remained a child to the end of his days.

To him life was work. And he knew the value of his work and was conscious of the full extent of the great talent, the genius, that he possessed. Most of the great artists of that period, Michael Angelo, Leonardo da Vinci, and Raphael, did not hide their lights under bushels.

His reputation as a ruffian equalled his reputation as an artist. He talked as much of his ability with the chisel. Indeed, he firmly believed that he had been destined by nature to the profession of arms and not to the profession of arts.

Women were much attracted to him. Strong women, like the Duchess of Florence, converted their attraction into hatred and intrigue against him and opposed him in everything. But no woman, not even the servant girl he married in his later years, was ever made happy by his love. He never allowed them to conquer him fully.

With the Duchess in his arms his mind was thinking of a block of marble out of which he intended to carve out his eternity. Even while he spoke of his great love and passion he was dreaming of statues in gold and silver with which to perpetuate his name for all times.

The Duchess of Florence, really Princess of Florence, was no fool and she was a true connoisseur of art. Her husband, of the great Medici family, had inherited from his ancestors an enthusiasm for art, but not their spirit of appreciation.

There at the station Maarn, on Nov. 11, Wilhelm arrived. He seemed somewhat shy and awkward and a little pale, beneath the tan of the battlefields. He was dressed in his gray field uniform, with the peaked field cap. Four German officers surrounded him closely, as though to shield their war lord with their bodies.

And even then his troubles were not at an end. From the very first day, the allies set up a clamor for his extradition, but the Dutch stoutly refused to abrogate the right to asylum. After a short stay in Amerongen, the Dutch government indicated the province of Utrecht as his residential territory, and he settled down in Doorn, where he bought the old castle "Huis Doorn."

There, at "Huis Doorn," his first wife died in 1921, and on Nov. 5, 1922, he married again—Princess Harmina, many years his junior. His health was bad and he nursed it carefully and successfully. He insisted on court economy, as in the old days at Potsdam, and he devoted his leisure to writing books after book demonstrating that Germany was not to blame for the war.

Now at 75, he is an imperial figure, sure of himself and of the Hohenzollerns' place in German history.

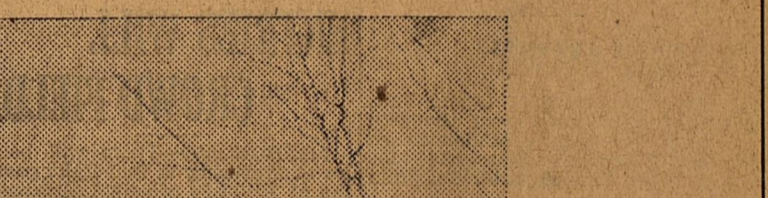
PO FLOODS IN ITALY HALTED

PARMA, Italy (AP)—Besides disciplining Italians, Italy has set out to discipline the River Po. The River Po, the most important river in Italy, experiences floods which cause a vast amount of damage every year. Already an army of 6,000 workmen are engaged on a stretch radiating from Parma of 120 miles. The defense from the annual floods is calculated to cover a territory of some 110,000 acres of land, and by a system of canals the overflow of water in flood time will be directed to irrigate nearby land.

The cost of the project is calculated at four hundred million lire, which will be spread over ten annual budgets.

Work is proceeding at present in the provinces of Parma, Piacenza, Mantua and Cremona. The dykes and protective work and the canals in the region already protected against flood have used up 1,500,000 cubic meters of sand and earth, and 90,000 cubic meters of stone.

When the work is completed, as it is hoped it will be in a couple of years, the Po will be navigable for its whole length, which means the realization of an old dream from the Adriatic to Milan.

Crane's protest that Odessa played ineligible players in beating that club recently has been upheld by Bill Collins, president of the Permian Basin Baseball league, and Odessa lost the game, was fined \$25 and ordered suspended until \$25 is put up to replace the fund attached by league officials.

Collins was in Midland Saturday. Loss of the game means Odessa and McCamey are tied for league leadership for the second half, with only three games left to be played. Odessa won the first half.

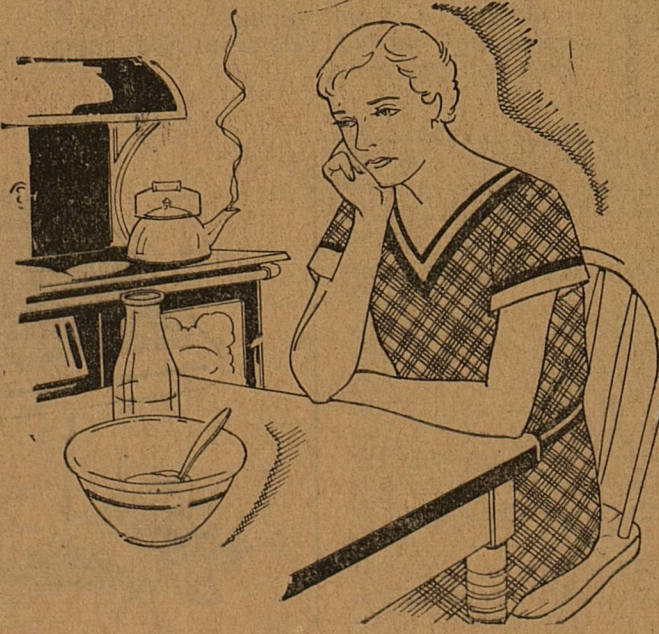

GONZALES. (P)—The "Lexington" of Texas, Gonzales sometimes has been called because it was the scene of what is regarded as the first fight in Texas' revolt against Mexico. The only thing Gonzales has in common with the Massachusetts town, however, is that both are somnolent. The Texans who fought at Gonzales in 1835 under Valentine Bennett, one of the first officers commissioned by Stephen F. Austin, didn't see the whites of the enemy's eyes. The encounter occurred in a fog and the Mexicans retreated.

Preliminary to the fight Colonel Ugartechea, commander of the Mexican force, sent Lieutenant Castenda to Gonzales to recover a cannon the Texans had borrowed for protection against the Indians. Andrew Ponton and Willy Martin, local officials, delayed the Mexicans until the cannon was buried in a nearby peach orchard. Subsequently the gun was taken up and mounted on a broad-tired wagon.

Within 48 hours Mathew Caldwell rounded up enough men to increase the Texas force to 150 and the Mexicans then were notified to come and get their cannon. Stimulated by a patriotic speech delivered by Rev. W. P. Smith the night before the Texans met the Mexicans along the river several miles north of Gonzales in a heavy fog the morning of Oct. 2. Firing continued several hours and the Mexicans retreated.

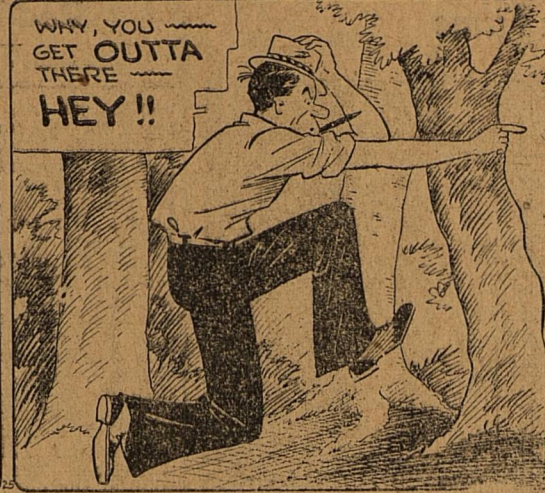
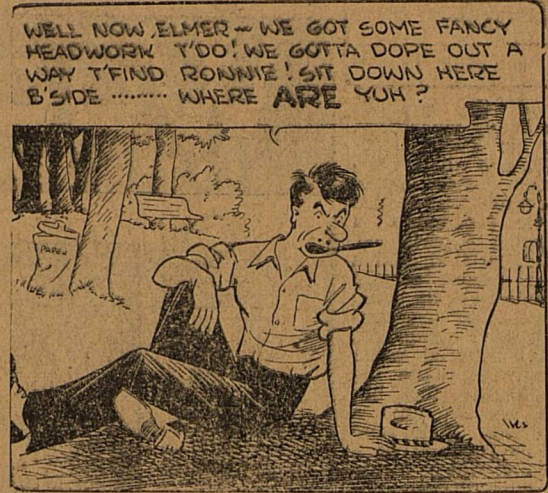

Wins Senatorial Primary at 29

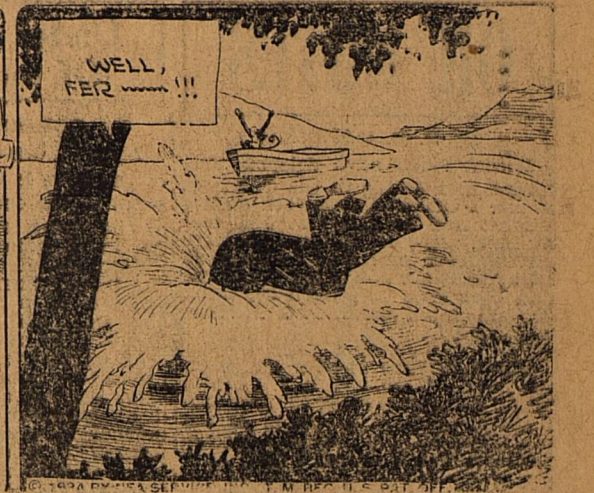
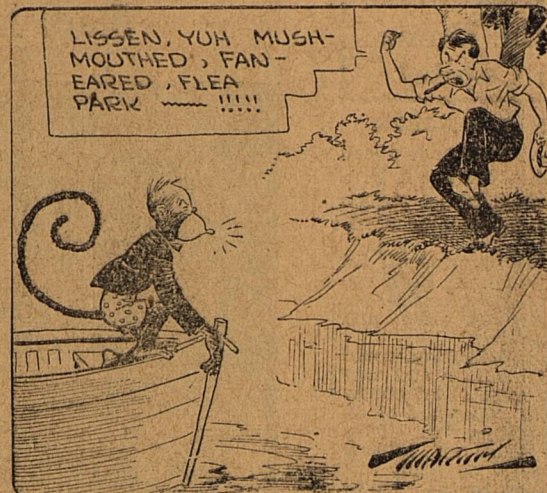
