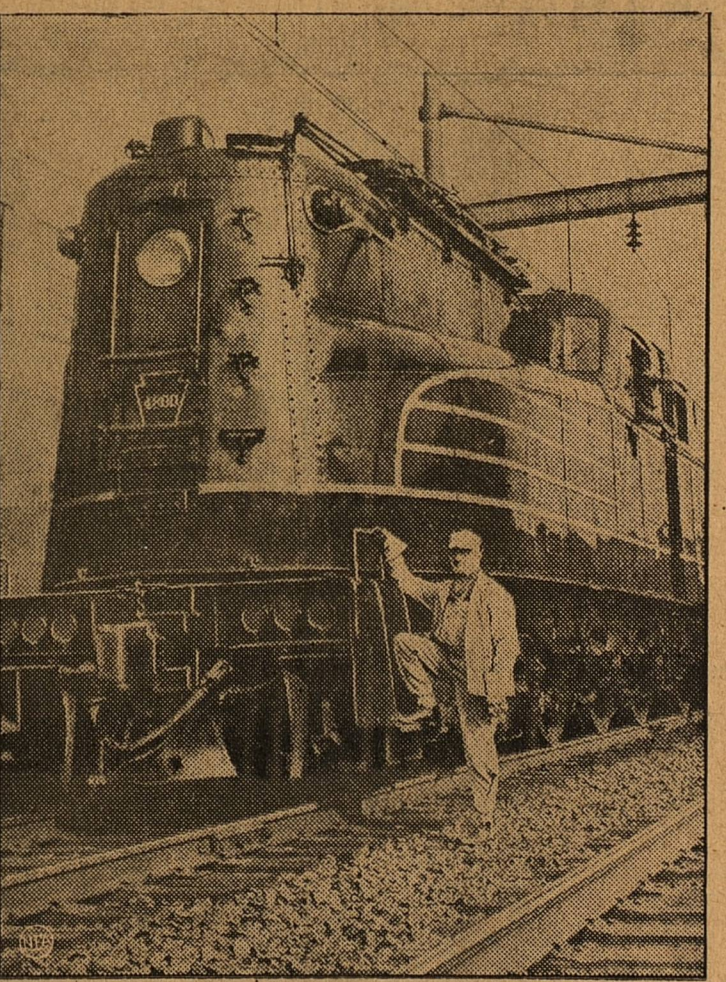

EXPERTS STILL BELIEVE IN THE BATTLESHIP

Decision on America's ship-building policy at the coming disarmament conference is complicated by the fact that there is still a good deal of uncertainty about the type of ships the American navy ought to have.

Naval authorities in the main stand firm for a fleet built about a strong nucleus of capital ships, or battle-ships, seasoned by a considerable number of heavy cruisers. Yet there is a wide belief that the battleship has outlived its usefulness, and that the terrific expense of maintaining these costly vessels is one the navy might very well avoid.

Add to this the growing feeling that airplanes and submarines are revolutionizing naval warfare, and you have a situation in which decision on a naval program would be difficult enough, even if it were not necessary to adjust our program to the programs of foreign powers.

A good exposition of the theory that the battleship is still the backbone of the fleet came recently in a public address by Rear Admiral Joseph K. Taussig, acting chief of naval operations.

America, says Admiral Taussig, needs the battleship because of its lack of naval bases—the battleship, with its wealth of heavy guns, serving as a kind of floating base which can protect lighter ships against superior forces.

Furthermore, says Admiral Taussig, the improvement of the submarine and aerial branches of naval warfare has made the battleship even more indispensable than before. It is the only warship which can be armored and protected sufficiently to withstand the shock of bombs and torpedoes.

Here we have a brief and understandable outline of the majority viewpoint in the navy; and it is worth reading, as an antidote to the free and easy talk one constantly hears about the obsolescence of the battleship.

We are often assured that submarines and airplanes are the all-important units of a fleet in modern times; but the experts charged with maintenance of our navy still believe—and seem to have reason for their belief—that a fighting fleet, in the last analysis, is only as strong as its capital ships.

THE TOSPY-TURVY WORLD

The topsy-turvy condition of the world today could hardly be appreciated better than through a contrast of American and Russian agricultural programs.

A Russian court in Tashkent recently put 55 cotton farmers on trial for their lives. They are accused of having grown only 60 per cent of the amount of cotton which the government expected them to grow this year; and if the court finds out that they limited production on purpose, all will be shot.

Contrast that, now, with the American farm program, which aims at cutting production rather than expanding it. Laying aside the blood-curdling savagery of the penalty involved, the contrast is illuminating.

In Russia, the farmer gets into trouble for not raising enough; in America, he gets into trouble if he raises too much. A mad world, this?

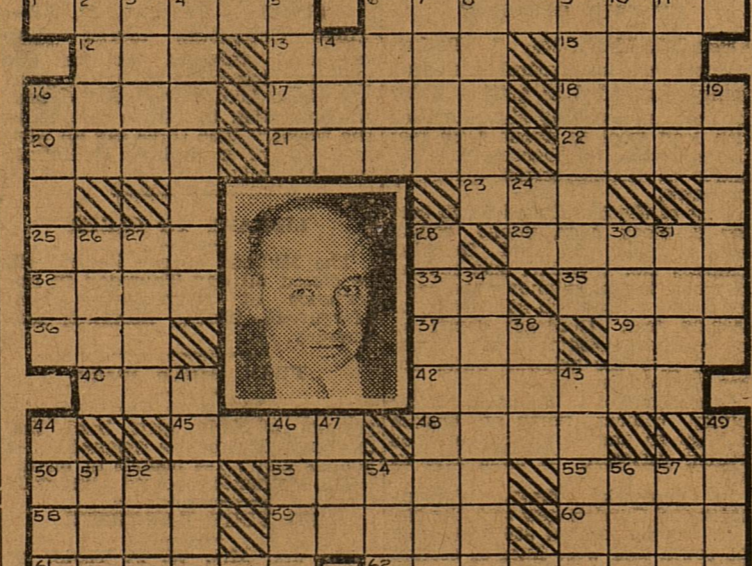
The Merry Widow

Time to Stuff (The Turkey) For Thanksgiving

It's really the stuffing rather than the turkey that smokes so good during Thanksgiving morning, perfuming the house with its steamy fragrance of sage and thyme. Personally, I can never see why folks go to such trouble to bring up new kinds of stuffings when the old-fashioned bread and egg combination, properly seasoned, is so absolutely the one perfect accompaniment to most fowl.

When to Use Onion Stuffing

My favorite old-fashioned bread stuffing is the foundation for a number of other good stuffings. It is made by simply adding mushrooms, chestnuts or onions to the basic rule. Any of these stuffings except the onion are suitable for all fowls. Never use onion stuffing with turkey or chicken.

Celery Stuffing

For celery stuffing, add 1 bunch finely chopped celery to plain bread stuffing. For oyster stuffing, add 1 pint oysters, using oyster liquor for liquid and adding 1 tablespoon lemon juice and 1 tablespoon minced parsley.

Trussing the Turkey

Trussing your turkey is important because it adds so much to the final appearance of the bird when it is placed before the host. Trussing is done after stuffing. To truss, first draw the thighs close to the body and hold them by inserting a long skewer under the middle point, running it through the body and out through the other side. Cross ends of drumsticks and fasten securely with a stout cord. Fasten cord to tail. Second, place wings close to body with tips pushed over first joint, making triangles on the sides of the turkey. Hold them with a second skewer forced through wings and body. Draw the neck skin under the back and sew with a soft cord.

"Please—just a moment," she answered. She turned to the door between them and the Ambassador's room. Quickly she pointed to the open transom above it.

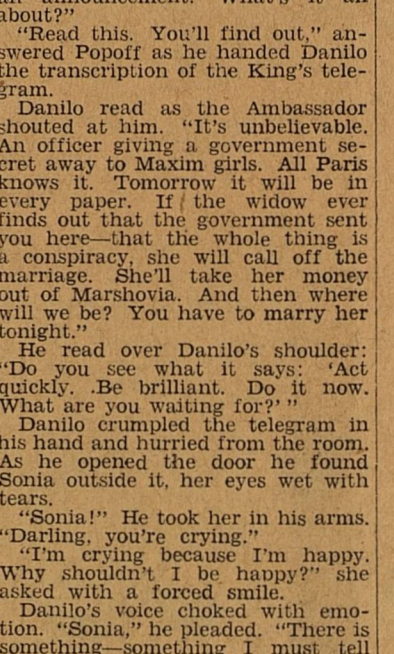
She had overheard everything. "Is there anything you can tell me that I don't know?" she asked bitterly.
