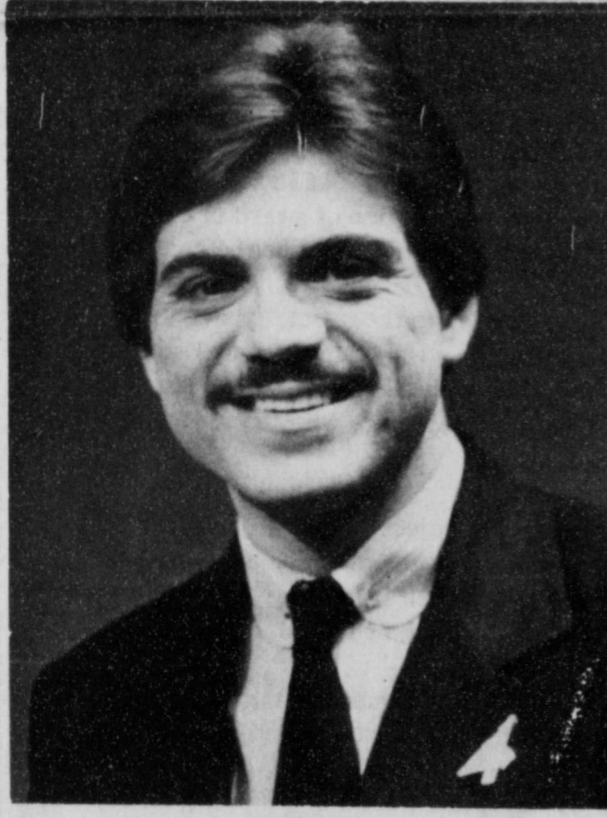

Webb Announces Candidacy For State Representative



J. T. Webb, former county official in both Ochiltree and Roberts counties, has announced that he is a candidate for State Representative of the 64th District. He will be running in the May Democratic Primary.
Webb, currently a resident of Miami, served one term as an Ochiltree County Commissioner, from 1973 through 1976. In the early 1950's, he served a term on the Roberts County Commissioners Court.
He maintains farming interests in Ochiltree County, south of Perryton, and is also an oil field contractor, representing independent oil producers in completing and producing oil and gas wells in Moore, Hutchinson, Hansford, Ochiltree, Roberts and Hemphill Counties.
Webb was born in Grayson County then moved to Reagan County, where he completed all his public school grades, graduating from Reagan County High School.
He attended Texas Christian University, Fort Worth, on a football scholarship, having his education interrupted by military service during World War II.
Webb served over three and one-half years in the Army Air Corps training command, during which time he spent six months at West Texas State, Canyon, in the college training detachment.
After the war, he returned to West Texas State to continue his college education, marrying Lois Flowers, daughter of an Ochiltree/Roberts county pioneer couple, who he had met during his WT training detachment period.
Webb has now resided for 31 years in the district which he wishes to serve in the State Legislature.
"I feel strongly for county government," Webb said in announcing his candidacy, "and my efforts will be directed toward regaining control for local entities.
"I am well acquainted with procedures in Austin and feel that I am well qualified to serve the 64th district as State Representative." Webb concluded.

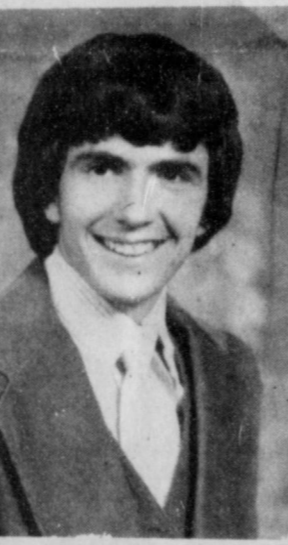
KAMR Weather Man To Present Seminar Here

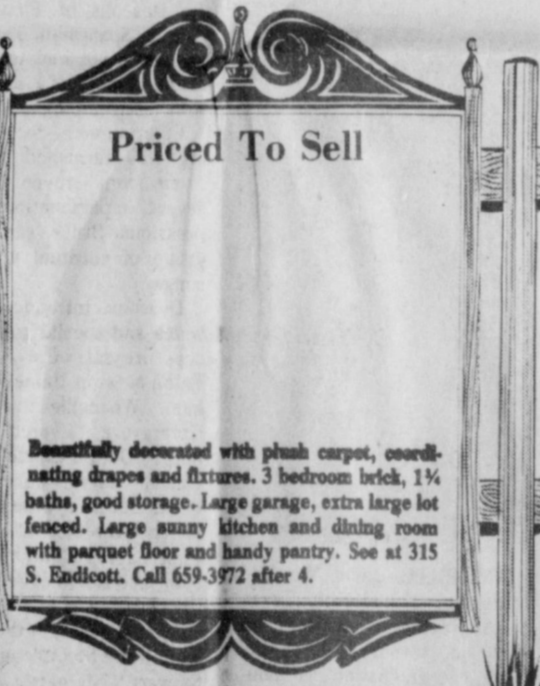

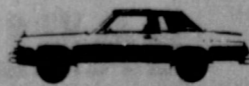
