Area disaster could crowd Spearman

The Disaster Committee of the City of Spearman met Tuesday night prior to the regular meeting of the Spearman City Council to shape operating procedures for various agencies that would either be directly involved in the event of disaster or could be of aid to the community. The committee is extremely useful in the aftermath of said disaster.

Certainly there are standard operating procedures for the police department, the fire department and the emergency medical service but this is not the entire story of a disaster should it come.

Along with procedures and positions of aid, the types of potential disasters were discussed. Police Chief Ron Robinson,

chairman of the committee and civil defense coordinator, noted that the federal government is particularly concerned with the transport of hazardous materials on the nation's highways and railroads.

Then there are the potential disasters of tornadoes and their aftermath, flash flooding, a severe and abnormal (for this climate) blizzard or a severe ice storm.

One item that has received little publicity but is of considerable magnitude in any consideration of disasters and their aftermath is the Pantex nuclear installation near Amarillo.

Chief Robinson noted that, at a regional meeting of several entities on disaster procedures, a spokesman for Pantex told the

meeting that the first step in dealing with an emergency at Pantex was--as soon as warning of such an emergency was sounded--to evacuate totally at least the first five counties surrounding the installation.

In addition to police, fire and EMS, there will be other transportation needs. These would involve both the school district and local industry--and possibly the agri-community. School buses are of a perfect width to carry litters crosswise making them mass evacuation ambulances. Industrial trucks, grain trucks and, certainly, earth-moving equipment would be a part of treating an area following a disaster.

Shelter was another phase of the study. Local structures will

have to be evaluated for some that might appear a stronghold, might actually be dangerous for occupancy say in a tornado or a blast that might occur from a transportation spill.

Also discussed was the problem of the business owner who would insist on rummaging through the remains of his property even though the area was considered still highly dangerous.

In the overall plan will be a need and, hopefully, a method of enlisting and utilizing volunteer help in almost every phase of dealing with a disaster. Too, there is even included in the master plan that would be used as a matrix for local disaster preparation, a plan for local ministers. Chief Robinson said

he thought a minister located in every shelter would be an ideal situation both for keeping calm and comforting the injured.

This initial meeting was actually an input session. However, it was decided to conduct disaster committee meetings monthly until a workable plan is established. As Chief Robinson noted, the committee must arrive at an official and workable agreement with all other agencies that would be involved: hospital, schools and industry.

The bottom line to all this is found in the reference to an emergency at the Pantex atomic installation: evacuation of a five-county area surrounding Pantex could throw a burden on the Spearman area of sheltering

some 6,000 persons or more. If a Pantex emergency has reached disaster proportions before evacuation is completed, a large number of that 6,000 persons could be serious injuries.

An evacuation because of Pantex would mean emptying the entire city of Amarillo!

The Phillips explosion of last January is a grim reminder that "it can happen here". If you as a person or an organization or a business are tapped to take part in the overall programming for disaster, remember that you will be serving your own personal interests as well as those of the community.

They visit in the hospitals, in the jails and nursing homes. They will be with you when you are born, when you are baptized, when you are married, when you face a crisis, when you die if they receive proper care and keeping. There are many things your

pastor will do for you, if you ask. There are many things a pastor will do with you, if you ask. But remember: Your pastor is not a mind reader with all the answers. She or he has personal needs... gets hurt... is human. Pastors have been known to cry with you, for you, over you. Pastors (though we hate to admit it) make mistakes and (even worse) have been known to sin. Pastors, therefore--like you--need mercy, forgiveness, love, grace. As they seek to understand, they also need to be understood. As they seek to love, they also

need your help in serving. Pastors need your prayers. And they also need to see their people in church often--at least once a week. Pastors are sensitive creatures (which is where we created). That's why they may be hard to track down when you need them, why they're always on the go. Lay people are sensitive, too. They have hurts and needs. They need proper care and feeding.

Some nursing home bids in

Members of the Hansford Hospital board of directors were not able to consider complete bidding on the nursing home as planned but were able to make headway on this and other items of hospital operation needing study at their regular meeting Thursday night.

Bids were opened and taken under consideration for plumbing, heating, electrical work and some medical equipment installations but no structural bids were in hand by the meeting hour. Both bidders and the hospital board had not realized that Monday was a holiday for postal operations.

All were optimistic since there are three strong bidders in the running and it was felt construction would be underway within days.

Members were shown a comparison of charges for seven services at seven other areas hospitals with the Hansford Hospital received for the services.

These were private room, semi-private, chest X-ray (1 view), urinalysis, complete blood count, operating room charges and costs for an anesthesiologist.

The hospitals sampled were at Perryton, Dumas, Borger, Guymon and the three Amarillo facilities. Spearman was higher on some items and at the very bottom of others.

Mark Hardin, the administrator, recommended the board consider a "median" figure. This simply means to set charges -- if adjustments are made -- at a midway level

The only action taken was on room charges. Any charges must be cleared with hospitalization insurance people which will take some two or three weeks according to Hardin. The proposed change would raise private room rent from \$75 per day to \$88. Semi-private would go from \$65 to \$79.

Hardin also explained that he was conducting an exhaustive survey of all charges observing that some services were not being charged for and would be priced. He noted that this would have an effect of holding prices down rather raising service costs because eliminating free services would offset any need for major rises in existing services charges.

The board authorized Hardin -- with the cooperation of the

doctors -- to emphasize and enforce visiting hours. The move grew out of complaints by the doctors that it was becoming increasingly hard to have privacy with patients during "rounds" and that some patients were not given the needed time to rest. It was also noted that visitors staying overnight with adult patients should be eliminated.

Use of an "EGG" service via telephone readout was authorized. It is available on a per-use basis rather than monthly service charge. The hospital would pay only when it was used. The EGG is an electric scan of brain waves much the same way an EKG measures heart action.

Remainder of the session was routine payments of bills and reports.
