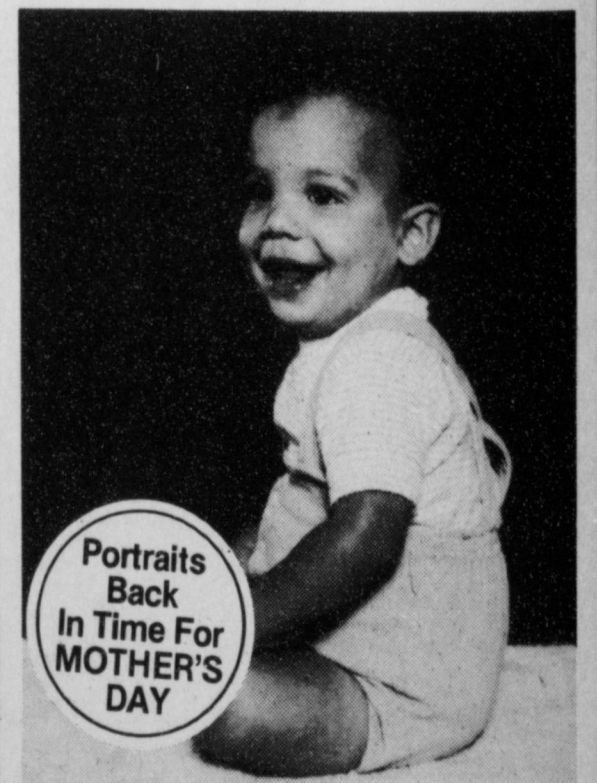

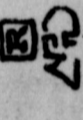
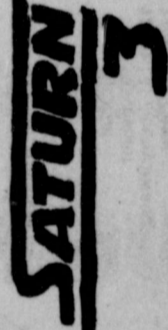

Girlstown Administration Building To Be Re-Built

Historical Marker Planned

Girlstown, USA, Borger, Texas - The Administration Building of the Girlstown USA Campus at Borger that was destroyed by fire will be re-built as soon as possible. This announcement comes from Bob Wilson, superintendent of Girlstown's Borger unit. In a meeting with a Long-Range Planning Committee of District 2-T1 of Lions International, plans were made to start the re-building process just as soon as plans can be finalized for the financing of this restoration of the original building.

Under the direction of District Governor Charles Cooley and

Past District Governor Jimmie Pigman, the Lions Clubs of the Panhandle, together with all of the citizens who wish to support Girlstown, a campaign is underway to raise \$250,000.00 to replace the destroyed building, and contents. "Much of the lost value was in inventory of supplies, garden tractors, paint, clothing for the girls, and office equipment and supplies." Superintendent Wilson stated. All of this will have to be replaced.

KGNC Radio is conducting a campaign to raise funds for this cause by asking for "\$1.00 per listener", and the Lions of the District ask that everyone support this effort. Each Lions Club

is asked to be a central agency for collecting any clothings, equipment, supplies or money that any community would like to contribute to this re-building cause.

April 5th, and April 12th, have been designated CLEAN UP DAYS at the Girlstown Campus. Medic Alert Week To Be Observed

April 6-12 is National Medic Alert Week. The members of the H & S Emergency Medical Service urges anyone with any type of medical condition to wear some type of medical alerting device.

We are promoting the Medic Alert Foundation. Engraved on their emblem is the medical condition, identification number and phone number of Medic Alert, which can be called for additional information.

Among the most often named reasons for membership are allergy to penicillin, diabetes, heart condition, taking anticoagulants, wearing contact lenses, allergy to sulfa, epilepsy, allergy to insect stings, allergy to bee stings, allergy to codeine, glaucoma, neck breather, and implanted pacemaker.

Some of the locations for applications and more information: Gordon Drug, Spearman Drug, Spearman Police Department, or any member of the H & S Emergency Medical Service.

1. The Medic Alert Foundation International is a nonprofit, charitable and tax-exempt organization classified by the U.S. Treasury Department under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. Founded in 1956, the Foundation provides the very best emergency medical identification system available in the world, serving persons with hidden or special medical problems that cannot be easily seen or recognized. Diabetes, special allergies, heart conditions and epilepsy are among more than 200 common reasons persons join Medic Alert. The Foundation is dedicated to saving lives and making the lives of its members secure through the knowledge that if they cannot speak in emergency situations, the Medic Alert emblem will speak for them.

2. Medic Alert's lifesaving system of protection is available for a one-time, lifetime basic membership fee of \$15.00.

A. The first of the three-part system is the metallic alerting device or emblem in the form of a bracelet or necklace. It bears the insignia of the medical profession and the words "Medic Alert" in red. On the reverse are engraved the medical problem or problems of the wearer, such as "Taking Anticoagulants", "Allergic to Bee Stings" or "Wearing Contact Lenses". The member's unique membership number and the telephone number of the Emergency Answering Service are also engraved.

B. The system of protection also includes a wallet card which is issued annually and contains personal and medical information in addition to that on the emblem. Because the card is dated, emergency personnel know they are working with information not more than a year old. Each member also receives annually a computer printout of all the personal and medical information in his emergency record so that it can be verified. He is reminded that the emergency record can be updated at any time upon request. When a membership is updated, a new wallet card is produced from the new information and sent to the member.

C. The third part of Medic Alert's system is the Emergency Answering Service which is available to all emergency personnel around the clock via a collect telephone call from any world location. The telephone number is engraved on the emblem and printed on the wallet card. Within seconds of receiving a call, emergency operators can relay emergency information from the computerized data base that might save a life. A percentage of each membership fee is placed in an established trust fund to assure that this service will always be available.

3. Proof that the Medic Alert system works is that in a recent 12 month period, over 2,000 members reported Medic Alert had contributed to the saving of their lives.

4. Foundation membership exceeds 1,500,000 Current growth rate in the U.S. is approaching 2,000 each week.

5. Medic Alert conducts on-going education and information programs. The professional education program is directed toward medical and other emergency personnel educating them to search for the Medic Alert emblem in very emergency situation and to take appropriate action upon finding it. The general education program involving thousands of volunteers is directed toward bringing to the attention of the public the value of emergency medical identification.

6. Among the most often named reasons for membership are allergy to penicillin, diabetes, heart condition, taking anticoagulants, wearing contact lenses, allergy to sulfa, epilepsy, allergy to insect stings, allergy to bee stings, allergy to codeine, glaucoma, neck breather, and implanted pacemaker.

7. There are 15 affiliate organizations internally, each governed by its own Board of Directors. Affiliates include Canada, United Kingdom and republic of Ireland, South Africa, Rhodesia, Netherlands, Zambia, Philippines, Australia, New Zealand, Fiji Islands, Jamaica, Cyprus and Malaysia.

8. The Board of Directors of Medic Alert is composed of physicians, corporation executives and leading businessmen. The Medical Advisory Committee and the General Advisory Committee are composed of persons who are interested in serving the Foundation and extending it within their communities and/or professions.

8. The Medic Alert Foundation International has been endorsed by a large number of organizations, a few of which are listed below. Additionally, many state and county medical societies and associations, hospital associations, pharmaceutical, nurses, medical assistants and service club groups have also endorsed Medic Alert. Many serve actively in the Foundation's education programs. A considerable number of these volunteer groups underwrite the cost of member-

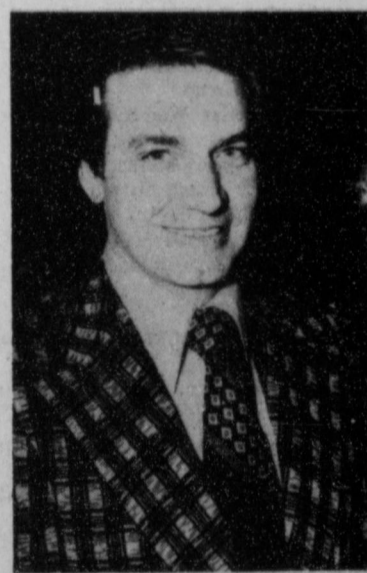

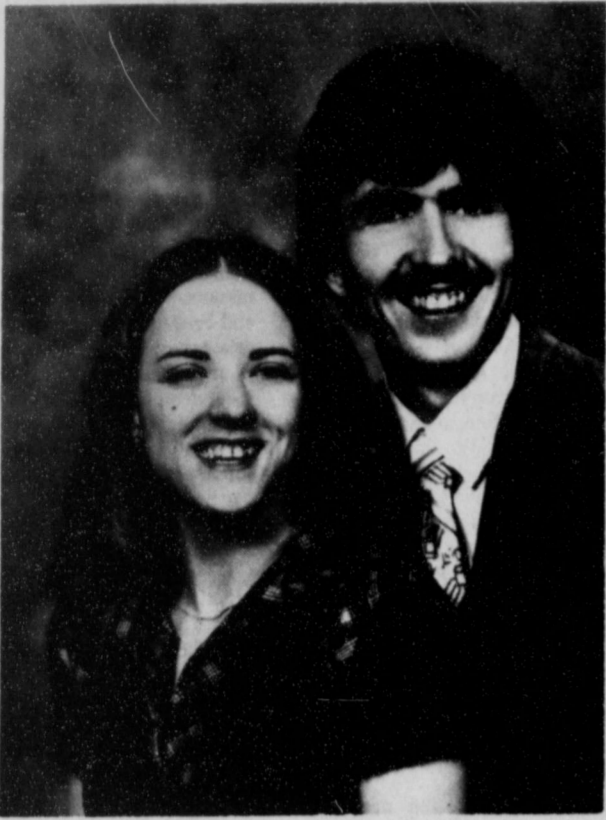
