lines and treatment facilities will be nor what kind of interest rate can be expected. Since it is unknown when the dam will fill up
enough to justify the remaining enough to ju
construction.
Another concern to Dumas City Commissioners was a review of engineering estimates and contractor bids for a paved road over the dam site. Apparently, $\$ 14,000$
was allotted to construct this road. Actual cost is expected to be up to $\$ 1.8$ million.
According to Lee and contrary to what the Dumas newspaper printed, the PDRA has contacted the State Highway Department and is
trying to work out a deal for a paved road across the dam site.
From the very beginning the project has had delays. But just as the project seemed to be ready to
take off, now that a bid was let out and ready for the approval of the

a new delay.
The project becoming a reality seems slim since Dumas pulled out from it. Dumas is the largest city in the proposal. Their share of the 25 year repayment schedule is
$\$ 143,489$ for the first 10 years and $\$ 143,489$ for the first 10 years and
$\$ 192,014$ for the final 15 years. Since they pulled their support these figures toward repayment are lost. And other ways to generate such revenue would have
to be discovered, causing an even to be discovered, causing an even
longer delay of the dam project. longer delay of the dam project.
The project started early in 1987 and the reservoir was to eventually hold 60,900 acre feet of water for recreation. Eventually the water
would be utilized for tap water for would be utilized for tap water for
the surrounding towns showing support for the project.
