Obecenity-in-rock resolutions have been approved by the City Council of San Antonio. The resolutions hold promoters and performers legally responsible if children are admitted to concerts determined to be obscene by a special examining board. The resolutions also ban promoters and performers from city-owned facilities if they are in violation of standards for obscenity. These standards will be developed by an examining board of local "child development specialists," said San Antonio Mayor Henry Cisneros. Using the resolutions as a guideline, City Attorney Lowell Barton will write an ordinance to be voted on at a later meeting. (San Antonio Light, September 20, 1985)

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

Judges have the authority to place certain conditions on probationers. The judge may require a drug offender to contribute money, equipment or services to drug prevention and or treatment programs. Article 42.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, VCS, gives the judge broad powers -- a sort of blank check to impose stipulations on probationers. Laredo Texans' War on Drugs Through PTA is one recipient of funds through this type of program. Contact Lydia Flores in Laredo at (512) 727-7272 for more information. Another example is in Bell County where the judge directs that those convicted of Driving While Intoxicated (DWI) contribute a designated amount as a court ordered restitution fee to a local citizen's Anti-DWI Task Force.
