November 4, 1975 may pouibly be one of the most imporrant dates for Texans and for the State of Texas for that is the date set for voting on the proposed changes in the Constitution of Texas.

Under the rules adopted by the Convention, each se parate Article (Proposition) required only a simple majority vote for approval and yet the whole document had to be approved by two thirds
of the delegates or 121 votes of the delegates or 121 votes. The chances for final approval of the Constitution grew slimmer and slimmer with pressures arising from every side. On the final night of the Convention, the new Constitution failed to receive
