have to increase their food prohave to increase their food production 4.5 percent per year to meet the growing food needs
of the world. He said these nations are unable to do this now There are two theories on
food production, he said. One group believes that more scientific production will take care of feeding the world. The oth-
er theory is that these breaker theory is that these break-
throughs are a long way away throughs are a long way away
and better land use and higher production per acre will be required. Dr. Thomas said he belongs to the second group.
The dean said that currentiy The dean said that currently only one third of the land on the earth is suitable for produc-
