piled in the North Plains Water District Office here.
Miss Dallasene Reynolds re-
ports that permits for 29 wells ports that permits for 29 wells
were issed to farmers in the were issed to farmers in the
county during the first quarter of 1966 .
Mirs Reynolds said practic-
ally all of the wells were being drilled on farms that already had one or more wells in operation.
The county now has a total
of 795 completed of 795 completed wells or permits pending on wells, of this total number, 719 are now water producing wells
Irrigation moved into the county in a big way in 1963 and 1964 when more than half of the wells now in production were drilled, Last year the
drilling pace slowed down as

Until the two rush years the irrigated acres in the counry accounted for a small part of the agricultural income.
