LYNX BEAT BOOKER 42-14

District Court Opens Fall Term Monday

Judge Max Boyer will open the September term of 84th District Court here Monday morning.

The docket for the September term of court will be set by the judge.

The Grand Jury for the September term will be called Tuesday morning. There are only a few cases awaiting grand jury action.

A Special Venire Panel of 150 members for jury service has been called for 10 a. m. Monday, Sept. 20. From this group defense lawyers and the state's lawyers will attempt to select a jury for the murder trial of John Grissiam.

Grissiam is charged with the murder of Mickey Westerfield of Gruver.

Booker Scores Twice On Lynx Starters

Quick scoring bursts gave the Spearman Lynx a 42-14 win over the stubborn Booker Kiowas here Friday night.

The out-manned, but stubborn Kiowas, led by Jay Trosper and Butch Henton, never gave up and scored twice on the Lynx first unit.

Spearman scored the first time they got the ball when Ken Shufeldt got outside the Booker defense and outran the defender to the end zone from 16 yards out. Dave Clement kicked the extra point with Larry Butts holding.

The touchdown was set up when Booker's Trosper tried a running quick kick from his own 24. He kicked the ball into one of his blockers and it bounded back to the 10. Trosper recovered it there and ran it to the Lynx 16 before being swarmed under.

Four plays after the kick-off, Shufeldt intercepted a Trosper pass at the Booker 25. Booker got the ball back on the first play when they took it away from Clement as he was tackled on a keeper play.

Booker picked up one first down before having to punt from their own 41. This time Trosper put the ball to the Lynx 16.

Shufeldt and Clayton Cochran picked up two quick first downs, then Butts broke free over the right side and raced 59 yards to score. He and Clement again added the point after touchdown with a perfect place kick.

Booker got their first touchdown on the first play of the second quarter when Butts got off a 44 yard punt which Trosper took on his own five.

The 125 pound quarterback took the ball straight up the

sideline. The whole area was jammed with players, but he stayed on his feet and broke into the clear at midfield. He went all the way with three Lynx chasing him.

Henton ran the points after touchdown to make the score 14-8.

Spearman picked up two more touchdowns in the second quarter, but got to keep only one. Midway of the period, Shufeldt broke free for a 57 yard scoring dash, but the play was called back to the Booker 43 and from there the Lynx were penalized 15 yards for clipping.

The good touchdown was set on a Booker miscue. Shufeldt intercepted a Trosper pass on the Booker 35 and raced into the corner, running over three tacklers enroute. He was tackled about the four and struggled on into the end zone but the officials ruled the ball dead on the six inch line.

Clement kept the ball on a quarterback dive and scored. Fullback Jerry Holton blasted over for the extra points to make the halftime score 22-8. There were only four seconds on the clock when Spearman kicked off.

Spearman got the second half kickoff and Shufeldt fumbled on the first play. Booker recovered and promptly went to work from the Lynx 41.

Trosper was injured just after the half and Booker went to the single wing with Henton doing the work.

He bulled the ball down to the Spearman 26 and there Richard Hughes picked up 10 but fumbled and Rennie Berry recovered for the Lynx.

Here Spearman put on their longest drive of the night with Butts doing the major part of

Future Grid Foes Look Strong In Victories and Defeats Friday

Three of eight future grid opponents of the Spearman Lynx tasted defeat Friday night, but one of these defeats raised the warning flag for the Lynx.

Gruver was defeated only 7-0 by White Deer in a tough defensive scrape. White Deer is rated one of the top 1-A teams in the state.

In defeat the Gruver Greyhounds showed they will be double tough for the Lynx next Friday. Also, Quarterback Sam Tipton returned to action after

knee surgery four weeks ago and proved to be a dangerous passer for Gruver.

Gruver threatened several times and only a fumble at the eight early in the game kept them off the scoreboard. Gruver knocked the ball loose from White Deer runners five times and recovered all five.

Stinnett raised the warning flags in the district race as they handled big Sunray 28-0. Stinnett showed speed and passing in scoring and their defense was too

fast for the Bobcats to get around.

Sunray's attack was seriously hampered when quarterback Max Greer broke his collarbone in the opening quarter.

Dalhart gave Guymon its annual drubbing as the Wolves came from behind to win 25-8. Big Danny Bush was the workhorse for Dalhart.

Phillips beat the Childress Bobcats 33-6 for their second win. Childress is rated as one of the

Standing-Room-Only Crowds See 'Thundering Sounds' Finales

The first summer season in the Palo Duro Canyon, "Thundering Sounds of The West", drew to an exciting conclusion Labor Day week end with standing room only crowds on three of the last nights. The last week's attendance was 6250 and the attendance for the season was 35917.

In order to understand the needs and travel patterns of the customers, the management of the theatre distributed questionnaires on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week to the heads of families, asking where they had first heard of the production and where they came from. Three hundred and forty six of these were returned. One hundred

forty-one came from the Panhandle outside of Amarillo and Canyon, 116 from Amarillo, 41 from other parts of Texas, 32 from out of state, 3 from foreign countries and 14 from Canyon.

Of these people, 216, had first heard of the show through word-of-mouth, 139 from newspapers, 72 from TV, 59 from radio, 25 from brochures, 3 from Travel Guide, 10 from a billboard and 16 from other sources.

Sixty-seven Amarillo people first heard of the show through a newspaper, 50 from the rest of the Panhandle, 7 from other parts of Texas, 2 from other states, and 4 from Canyon.

In this three day period, cards were filled out by people from Denver, Colo.; Fort Scott, Kans.; Green Bay, Wis.; Tulsa, Okla.; Liberal, Kans.; Clovis, N.M.; Pierre, S.D.; Shreveport, La.; Hopkinsonville, Ky.; Fayetteville, Ark.; Gallup, N.M.; Ashland,

Kans.; Baltimore, Md.; Hayward, Cal.; Seattle, Wash.; Hollis, Va.; Renton, Wash.; Marshalltown, Iowa; Oklahoma City, Okla.; Selma, Ala.; Cape Girardeau, Mo.; Savannah, Ga.; Weatherford, Okla.; Dublin, Cal.; Saskatchewan, Canada; and Kassel, Germany.

Sweater Storage

Let the moths cast hungry eyes upon them—they will have to look elsewhere for a meal.

COOLER CLEANER

When ordinary tap water won't remove the sand and grit from leafy vegetables, try soaking them in a solution of a scant teaspoon of water conditioner to a gallon of water. Wipe off excess moisture. It works fine with the embedded dirt in cauliflower and asparagus spears, too.
