Golf was one of the first games to be covered by an insurance liability policy. It was called the "golfers' liability policy" and protected clubswingers against claims of injury while they went for those long drives on the fairway.

Later, other kinds of sports such as basketball, tennis, football, baseball, hunting, and fishing were included in the policy.

After that, a broad sports liability form came into use. With this form, the insured was covered for bodily injury liability involving any kind of athletic sport or game. Bicycle riding was also included, as well as activities on the water with canoes and rowboats, as long as they were not being used for commercial purposes. There was also liability using sailboats or power boats not owned or chartered by the insured.

Individual sports liability for nonprofessionals is seldom written now because of the use of the Comprehensive Personal Liability Policy. That form includes sports protection. However, professional athletes still get sports liability because the comprehensive form excludes occupational and business activities.


