coived his cortification in the Voc Ag. Coop program at Tarleton State University. He attended a throe day workshop at the univer
sity for his cortification. The worksity for his certification. The work-
shop was held in conjunction with the Texas Education Agency and was conducted by several members of the Trirenton State University Agriculture Education Dept. and reprosentatives of TBA
from Austin, All phases of the Vo. Ag. Coop program were thoroughly covered at the workshop which was attended by 30 Voc Ag . teachers from all areas of Texas. Voc. Ag. Coop program'attend Vac Ag. class each day for one hour, and they also work in the aftemoon for approximately three hours at an agricultural job. They must work a
minimum of 15 hours per school minimum of 15 hours per school
week on the agricultural job, and they receive wages, while learning an ag. skill. According to York the program is working well and is very practical as the students not only
receive instruction and training in receive instruction and training in
the classroom but also get "hands" on training at the selected ag. work station while receiving wages for their work. The work station must
