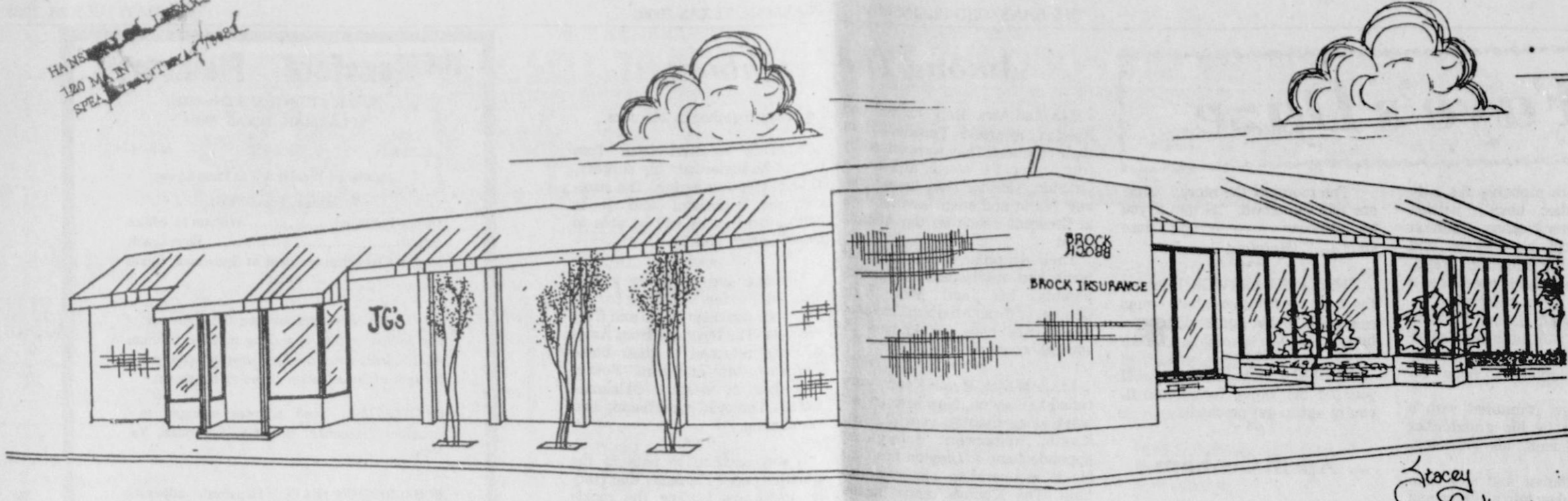

### Bankers see deflated economy continuing

Mid year numbers in county Banks are in. Deposits are up at First State Bank over mid year last year, with loans down slightly. Their statement of condition for the first six months of 1984 showed deposits of \$47,654.00 and loans of \$28,539,000. This year deposits are \$50,850,000 and loans are \$27,711,000.

Gruver State Bank deposits are also up from last year as well as loans. The statement of condition

for the first six months of the year at the Gruver State Bank in 1984 showed deposits of \$24,316,000 and loans of \$15,824,316. Their statement for 1985 shows deposits of \$28,636,000 and loans of \$16,639,000.

The new bank in Spearman, the First National Bank, which opened its doors Wednesday April 24, 1985 lists deposits of \$7,865,000 and loans of \$1,837,000. They began business with 3,000,000 on deposit.

Bankers are hopeful that the cattle market will rebound later this year. With the cattle market nearly down the tubes during the first half of the year and low wheat prices, it's had an impact. The oil and gas industry continues to sing the blues. This is having a sharp impact on some retailers.

Thus the stage is set for the second half of the year. Like the rest of us, bankers are hoping that things get better.

### School system compared with state averages

State aid to local schools increased by \$1 billion last year to a total of \$4.6 billion. To pay for it, the special session of the legislature last summer enacted the largest tax bill in the state's history.

Not to be outdone, school trustees in the 1,068 local school districts levied the largest school property tax increase in history. \$519 million-for a total tax bill of \$4.1 billion.

Locally the Spearman ISD's tax levy was increased by 11.4% over last year. Gruver ISD's taxes were increased 5.3% and Pringle-Morse ISD went up 25.9%.

The figures come from the latest issue of Bench Marks for 1985-86 School Districts Budgets in Texas, an annual publication of the Texas Research League, and Austin-based, educational corporating engaged in governmental research.

School budgets adopted last year called for spending \$3,103 per student for current operations.

Spearman's budget provided for \$4,191.75 with 722 students for current operations expense. Gruver \$4236.57 with 476 students, and Pringle-Morse ISD \$8,904.14 with 71 students.

Four of each five of these dollars were spent for salaries. Statewide payroll expense averaged \$2,487 per student, as compared to Spearman's average of \$3072. Gruver's \$3,159 and Pringle-Morse average of \$5,115.

The average salary for classroom teachers paid by Spearman in 1983-84 was \$21,511. Gruver, \$21,169 and Pringle-Morse \$19,076. The average among all school districts in Texas was \$20,117 per classroom teacher.

There was an average of one teacher for 13.0 Gruver had 11.9, Pringle-Morse 7.5, Spearman 13.0.

School property tax rates in 1984-85 average \$0.622 per \$100 of market value. The school tax on a property selling for \$100,000 was

\$622 in the average school district.

Locally the rate on market value in Spearman ISD was \$666.00, Gruver ISD, \$636.00 and Pringle-Morse, \$582.00 on property selling for \$100,000.

If the property were a homestead or owned by a senior citizen, the school tax would be less because of various exemptions. Open-space land that qualified would be valued on its productivity value rather than market value.

As compared to the billion-dollar increase in state aid last year, only \$129 million more state funds will be distributed to schools next year. Only 492 districts will get more; the other 576 districts will receive less. This strategy to equalize presupposes that local property taxes will remain about the same. However, the large property tax increase last year, the report concludes, substantially negated the equalization improvement that the legislature tried to achieve.

### Burglaries in county cleared

Five of seven burglaries committed in the Spearman area the last two months have been cleared up, according to Sheriff R.L. McFarlin. The first burglary was at the Tommy Russell home near Spearman. A thief took knives and guns from the Russell home, he has been apprehended. The same thief took \$800 from the Bruce Stinson home which is located a few miles east of the Russell home.

A diamond ring was taken from Mrs. Cope's residence in Spearman. The diamond has been recovered and the burglar has been apprehended.

The Ray Converse home, in Spearman, was burglarized twice. The burglar took money, guns and knives during the robberies, he has been apprehended.

The only 2 unsolved burglaries in Spearman are Chester Slaten, where guns were taken and Georgia Chavelier where the burglar took money.

Sheriff McFarlin notifies the public that the city and county are working together to clear up these burglaries.

### Showers were appreciated

Spearman received a good rain Wednesday in a turbulent storm. Reports over the area are from 1/2 inch, to 1.08 inches here in Spearman.

On July 23 we received a nice little shower downtown but it apparently stayed in the downtown area, because residents south reported no rain.

Dr. Dave Muthali, Chief of Medical Staff at Hansford Hospital stated that he felt that one of the greatest needs was getting those "BACK TO SCHOOL PHYSICIANS AND IMMUNIZATION SHOTS". Dr. Muthali stated that August was a busy month and encourages all parents of the school

children to make 'Earlier' appointments if possible, to avoid the rush!

Dr. Doug Steger, O.D. was in agreement with Dr. Muthali and stated that in his office, desired appointments for Back to School eye examinations were more difficult to get at this time of year. Dr. Steger encourages parents not to wait until the last minute to bring in children for new frames, lens or a new prescription if they are to be obtained prior to the first day of school.

Dr. Stanton W. Cobb, D.D.S. made the point that the new State Regulations for school attendance did not allow a great deal of

absenteeism for Doctors appointments. He felt this should be an important fact in planning Doctors visits. Dr. Cobb said, "It would be nice if everyone could get checked and treated prior to school's starting so that the time students have to miss from school could be saved for the cold and flu season."

## Karen's Kozy Korner

During summer weather children playing outside run the risk of heat exhaustion.

Children run a higher risk for several reasons.

Children are prone to heat illness because they have more skin surface for each pound they weigh than adults, so they absorb more heat.

Because children's sweat glands don't work as well as adults until after puberty, their bodies don't regulate temperature as well as either. Children also take almost twice as long as adults to get accustomed to different temperatures.

When children get involved in playing, they may ignore thirst, become overheated, fatigued and dizzy.

To avoid problems with heat illnesses, recommendations are

that children, and active adults, follow these guidelines:

\*Drink at least eight cups of plain water each day.

\*Drink at least half a cup of cool water every 15 minutes during the activity. The body absorbs cool water faster than warm.

\*Weigh before and after the activity. Drink two cups of water for every pound lost during the activity.

\*Drink water, since it is absorbed faster than electrolyte drinks, sodas and juices.

\*Avoid salt tablets.

Students who are enrolled in the Voc. Ag. Coop program attend Voc. Ag. class each day for one hour, and they also work in the afternoon for approximately three hours at an agricultural job. According to York the program is working well and is very practical as the students not only receive instruction and training in the classroom but also get "hands" on training at the selected ag. work station while receiving wages for their work. The work station must be agriculturally related and be approved by the agriculture instructor, but York reports this is not a problem because of the number of agriculture employees in the Spearman area.

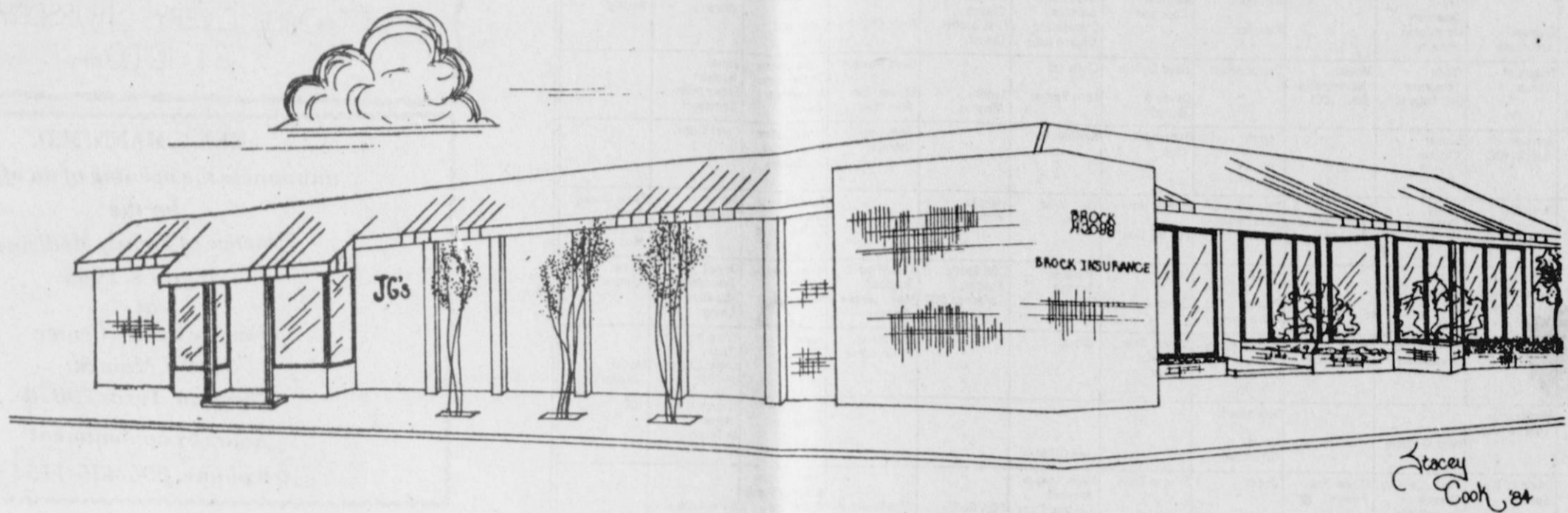
