Burn Victim Doing 'Remarkably Well'

Chris Hagerman acts like a normal

He crawls, pulls up and is cutting teeth, according to his mother, and seems to up with his age level in development.

The only difference between him and other toddlers is that he was burned over 30 percent of his body in a car fire last September, has gone through several surgeries and pressure packs remainonhis face and limbs.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Steve Hag-

ermanof Roscoe, the youngster spent 36 days in the Parkland Burn Center in Dallas after a car he was in caught on fire—apparently from an electrical short.

He was released from Parkland Oct. 8
after several surgeries. The most recent surgery was Nov. 20 for a cornea
implant in his right eye, Mrs. Hagerman said. So far the operation is successful.

Although expected not to live Chris

Although expected not to live, Chris has proved to be a remarkable little toddler. Doctors said he would never function normally, but he does. And there wasn't much hope that the cornea implant would work, but it did.

He was originally blinded by the fire that caused minor burns on his mother. The cornea implant is intended to give him useful vision in his right eye, and the doctors are considering an implant for his other eye, Mrs. Hagerman said.

Clear plastic pressure masks have been placed on his face to minimize scarring from the skin grafts there. Original grafts were made from a cadaver to prepare his body for taking grafts. Then skin was grafted from his scalp and more recently from his shoulders.

"Only your skin from your clavicle upwards has the blushing capability," Hagerman said, "so it is a different color than the rest of your body. That's why they could take it off of his head and shoulders."

The pressure masks should prevent scarring, she said, and will be used for about a year ssure dressings are also being usis arms and legs.

"The burn doctors say he is much improved." Hagerman said. "I just wanted to let people know how he is doing. So many times I hear that someone thinks his fingers were charred off or he can't function. He's doing great. He's really remarkable."

would include such things by different organizations as Meals-On-Wheels, locations of these organizations and other material available from churches, Chamber Of Commerce etc.




