Murray Named City Manager

Jim Murray, 31, for some months assistant to the city manager, has been named to the city manager position succeeding Len Simpson who has resigned to enter private business locally.

A native of Midland, Murray is a veteran of the U.S. Marine Corp. He graduated from West Texas State University in 1976 with a degree in Public Administration.

He served as a Public Service intern out of the Governor's office in conjunction with the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission, Amarillo, then as an administrative aide to PRPC.

He served two years as city manager of the city of Fritch. Following this tenure, he served as a management analyst for the City of Amarillo,

responsible for the city's financial assistance program involving federal, state and local agencies.

Murray has an avid interest in water sports, golf, reading and travel. Pursuing the latter interest, he has been in 25 states, Mexico, Guatemala, Ecuador, Honduras, Columbia, Australia, Japan, Okinawa and Southeast Asia.

In assuming the duties of Spearman City Manager, Murray said he planned to continue the present pattern of programs established by the administration.

The first pressing duty to fall upon him was the business of getting a new police chief settled in. The new chief reports May 1.

Ronald Robinson, 28, currently chief of police for the city of Seagraves, will assume the armed forces. The places he same duties for the city of Spearman, May 1.

Robinson holds a bachelor's degree in law enforcement and a master's degree in criminal justice. Also, he has eight years experience in the security police of the U.S. Air Force.

He left the military after eight years of service to further a career in law enforcement. Robinson is married, the father of two children.

Girls Compete In Regionals

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Plainsman went to press before results of the girls One-AA track meet finals at Lubbock, Saturday, were established. These will be in the Thursday edition of the Reporter.

Spearman had three girls—Sherry Greene, Kenda Burke and Jan Davis—and a 1600 relay team participating in the One-AA finals at Lubbock.

Sherry Greene was trying to move up from the third place position she established last year in the horizontal jumps. She qualified in the long jump Friday with a 16-5½ and 12.4 in the 100. This left her still third in qualifying in the long jump and second in the 100 behind a 12.2.

Kenda Burke qualified in high jump competition with a 5-1 behind two 4-10s and three 5-0s.

Jan Davis qualified in the 400 with a 61.7 putting her well in front of all other qualifiers with times ranging from 62.5 to 67.0.

Spearman's 1600 relay team went into the finals with a qualifying 4:29.2—just about in the middle between 4:15.5 and 4:37.2.

The girls regional meet for both One-AA and One-AAAA opened at Lubbock, Friday. Competition at this level was for berths in the various state meet finals.

Drug Seminar Thursday

Sheriff McFarlin said there would be a display of narcotics and the paraphernalia common to drug use but the symptomatic behavior of youngsters and adults, too, will be a strong emphasis.

In addition to the sheriff and the team that will be assisting him, there will be a film shown which McFarlin said would be one of the best available on the subject.

The seminar will be conducted in the Fellowship Hall of First Christian Church, Gruver beginning at 1:30 p.m.

It will be another in a series of programs planned by members of the Happy Hearts Club for both interest and awareness of the entire community to dangers, social ills and potential betterment, among other features from time to time.

The seminar Thursday is open to the public.

SKATEBOARDING SAFETY TIPS

Last year there were an estimated 27,500 skateboard injuries serious enough to be treated in hospitals, 8 1/2 times as many as there were in 1974. Parents who buy them for their children should take steps to minimize accidents.

Equipment. Buy skateboards that are well constructed; they cost more but they're safer. Check the skateboard each week or so for any loose nuts or screws and to see that the wheels spin freely and are not wearing down unevenly. Require your child to wear protective equipment - at least a helmet and gloves, and ideally elbow and knee pads, too.

Safety Rules. Impress upon your child the importance of these do's and don'ts:

- Do apply non-skid tape to the top of the skateboard.
- Don't skate in streets that are heavily traveled or on sidewalks where other people are walking.
- Do avoid sloping surfaces where as many as there were in 1974.
- Don't hitch rides on moving vehicles.
- Do skateboard with a friend.

MEETING OF REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The City Council of Spearman, Texas met in regular session in council chambers of City Hall March 25, 1980 at 7:30 P.M. Mayor C. Ralph Blodgett presiding. Aldermen present: Cudd, Pittman, Nicholson, Loftin, Beedy. Also present: City Manager, Lenis Simpson, Administrative assistant, Jim Murray, Secretary, Donna Thomas, Fire Chief, Ronnie Antalek, EMS Director, Ed Williamson. Visitors: Buz Baker, L.D. Burns, Ray Ingle, Billy Miller.

PLEDGE AND INVOCATION The pledge of Allegiance to our flag was led by Simpson followed by the invocation given by Mayor Blodgett.

CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING ON MARCH 25, 1980 Motion was made by Cudd to approve the minutes of regular city council meeting on March 11, 1980 as written. Second by Pittman. Motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF SEALED BIDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE THIRTY-TWO (32,000) POUND GVW TRUCK CAB AND CHASSIS. Motion was made by Pittman to table the bids and make a detailed analysis of bids and tally them at the next regular city council meeting. Second by Beedy. Motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF SEALED BIDS FOR SEALCOATING APPROXIMATELY 50,412 S.Y. OF MUNICIPAL STREETS. Motion was made by Beedy to award the low bid of .52 a S.Y. to lipham construction company of Aspermont, Texas. Second by Nicholson. Motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PLACE FOR BID OF APPROXIMATELY FIVE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED (5,400) FEET OF TWO (2) INCH WATER LINE FROM STATE HIGHWAY 215 TO MUNICIPAL WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY. Motion was made by Loftin to authorize the city manager to negotiate for approximately 5,400 feet of 2 inch water line from the Gruver highway to the municipal wastewater treatment facility. Second by Nicholson. Motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF ISSUING CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION FOR FUNDING A PORTION OF PHASE II MUNICIPAL AIRPORT CONSTRUCTION AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE FIRE STATION. Motion was made by Cudd to authorize the Mayor to enter into a contract with a financial advisor and an architect. Second by Loftin. Motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PLACE FOR BID VARIOUS EMERGENCY MEDICAL EQUIPMENT. Motion was made by Nicholson to authorize the city manager to place for bids various emergency medical equipment. Second by Beedy. Motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: FORDISCUSSION OF POLICE CHIEF APPLICATIONS UNDER ARTICLE 6252-17G VTCS. Motion was made by Loftin that council go into executive session for the purpose of discussing applications for Police Chief. Second by Pittman. Motion carried.

At 9:10 P.M. Mayor Blodgett called for an executive session under Article 6252-17G of VTCS.

At 9:57 P.M. Mayor Blodgett declared the meeting open and stated that no action was taken and no vote was made. Only Police Chief applications were discussed.

OTHER Meeting dates for the month of April were set for the 15th and 29th and a special city council meeting was set for April 7th to swear in the new Council Members.

ADJOURN Nicholson made the motion to adjourn. Mayor Blodgett pronounced the meeting adjourned.
