Chemical seed protectants can prevent many disease problems on small grain caused by ungal and bacterial organisms With the fall pla
here. Wendell Horne, Extension plant pathologist, advises growers who save their own seed or buy untreated seed to apply such protectants before planting to insure a vigorous and healthy stand. Most commercial seed companies use a treatment
Seed-borne fungi and bac-
destroy the seed in the soil or attack seedlings as they struggle through the soil. Such diseases are referred to as seedling blights, says Horne, and often result in a significant lostt of stand.
Mercury-type seed treatments such as Cerasan and Panogen have been highly effect-
ive as protectants for small grain seed. These materials may be applied in a rotary seed treater made from a 50 -gallon drum or they may be applied with machinery devised for that purpose.
Some fungi are also borne within the seed and are not affected by chemical treatment. is an example of this type of

Are you one of the many homemakers who use ground beef to advantage in menu planning? I hope so, because ground beef, or hamburger, is designed for huge appetites and pocketbook ease. Ground beef accounts for about 25 percent of ALL BEEF sales. Not all ground beef is the ground composition, Regular usually indicates ground beef with a high proportion of beef fat, and many people prefer it for the rich flavor imparted by the fat. Lean ground beef is made from the chuck of various cuts of those that go into hamburger It costs a bit more per pound. but is probably the most efficient purchase.
Ground round steak is the leaneast of all ground beef and usually sells for about the same price per pound as sliced round steak. It costs more but shrinks less in cooking than any other
type of ground beef type of ground beef,
Handle ground be
possible. Too much little as possible. Too much handduct tough and packed. Keep ground beef under re frigeration and use it within three days after purchase. Try this idea for a different twist in using ground beef.
Flatten a hamburger patty to about $1 / 4$ inch thickness. Place on the pattie a slice of toma to, chopped onion to taste, shredded cheese (about 1 tab lespoon), and salt, Cover with another flattened hamburger patty (like a sandwich) and
