TEAMS

The assessment program, called the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS), was required by House Bill 72, which also required students at the eleventh grade level to be tested as a condition for receiving a high school diploma.

The purpose of the TEAMS program is to determine if students are mastering educational programs in mathematics, reading and writing.

The TEAMS tests were administered to the Eleventh (11) grade students October 28 and 29th, 1986. The results of this October 1986 exit level test have been received and we are pleased to announce that all eleventh grade students mastered both the Mathematics and Language Arts sections of the test, thus making 100% total mastery for the 1988 graduating class who are currently enrolled at Spearman High School.

Nearly 75 percent of adults believe that breastfeeding is the best way to feed a baby according to a nationwide survey released last month by US Surgeon General C. Everett Koop.

The results of this survey affirm the efforts of La Leche League International, a support group for breastfeeding mothers founded 30 years ago this month. Fewer than 25 percent of new mothers were breastfeeding their babies in 1956 when La Leche League began. Now that figure has risen to 60 percent in the USA, which "is reassuring" according to the Surgeon General, who goes on to say: "We encourage every new mother to breastfeed. It's one of the best things she can do for her child." In recognition of La Leche League's efforts in providing information, encouragement, and advice to breastfeeding mothers, Illinois Governor James R. Thompson says: "La Leche League has been the source of valuable and reliable information on breastfeeding." In just three decades, he goes on to say, "breastfeeding has regained acceptance as a natural and healthful means of nutrition for newborns and infants."

La Leche League's impact has spread beyond the U. S. Kathleen Cravero, Projects Officer for UNICEF, explains that "the promotion of breastfeeding is one of the key strategies in the child health revolu-

tion promoted by UNICEF in developing countries. Many of our field offices have worked directly with La Leche League Groups on the national and local levels...UNICEF itself has learned much from La Leche League's approach." Ms. Cravero continues by mentioning "the high-quality cooperation that La Leche League International organization with affiliates in over 43 countries."

La Leche League of Spearman joins with 3200 La Leche League Groups around the world in celebrating the organization's 30th Anniversary this month. The next local Group meeting will be held on Dec. 11th at 7:00 p.m. at 514 S. Main, Perryton, Tx.

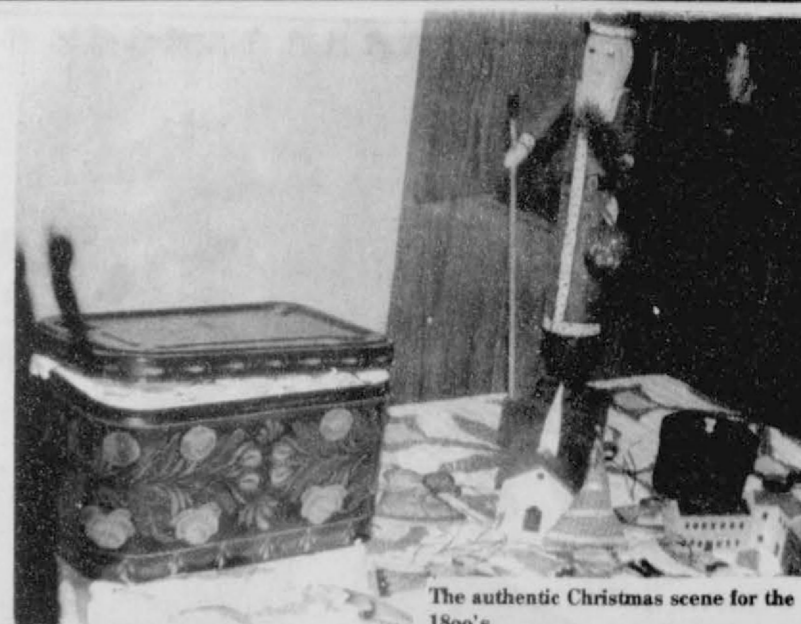

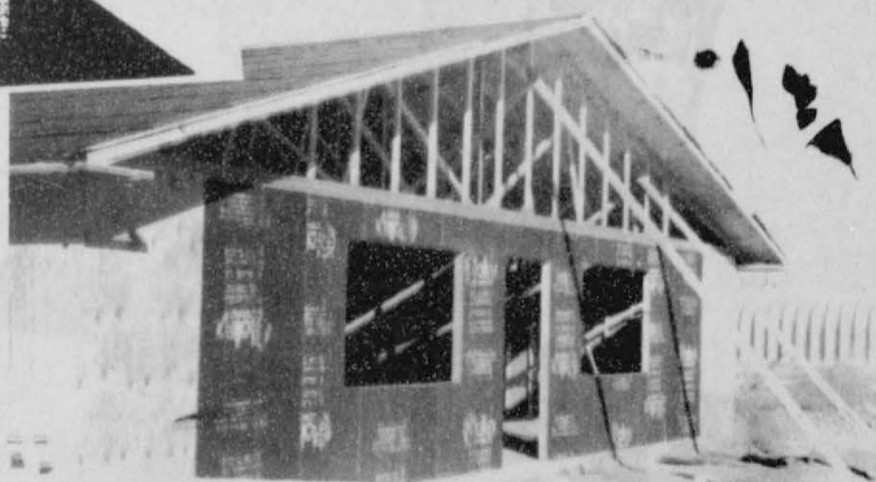

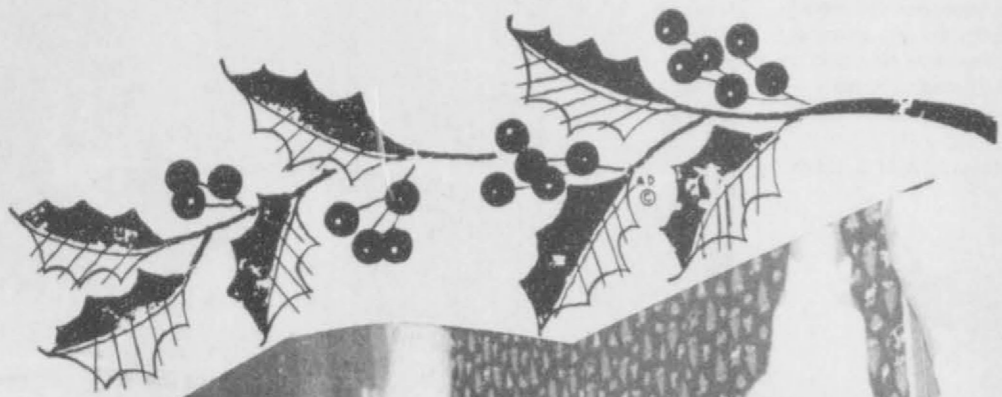
