### The Nativity

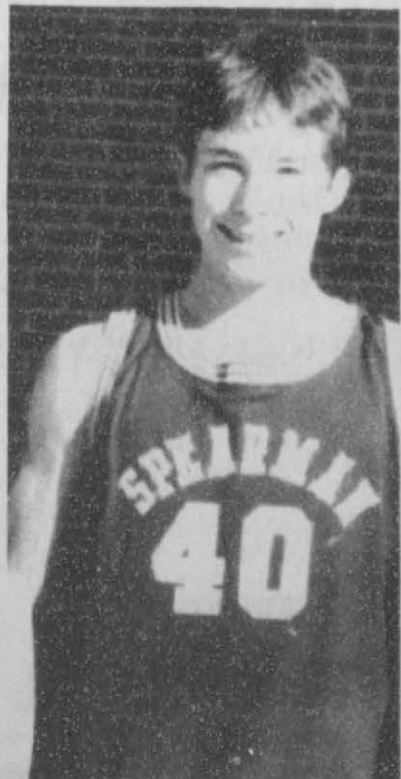

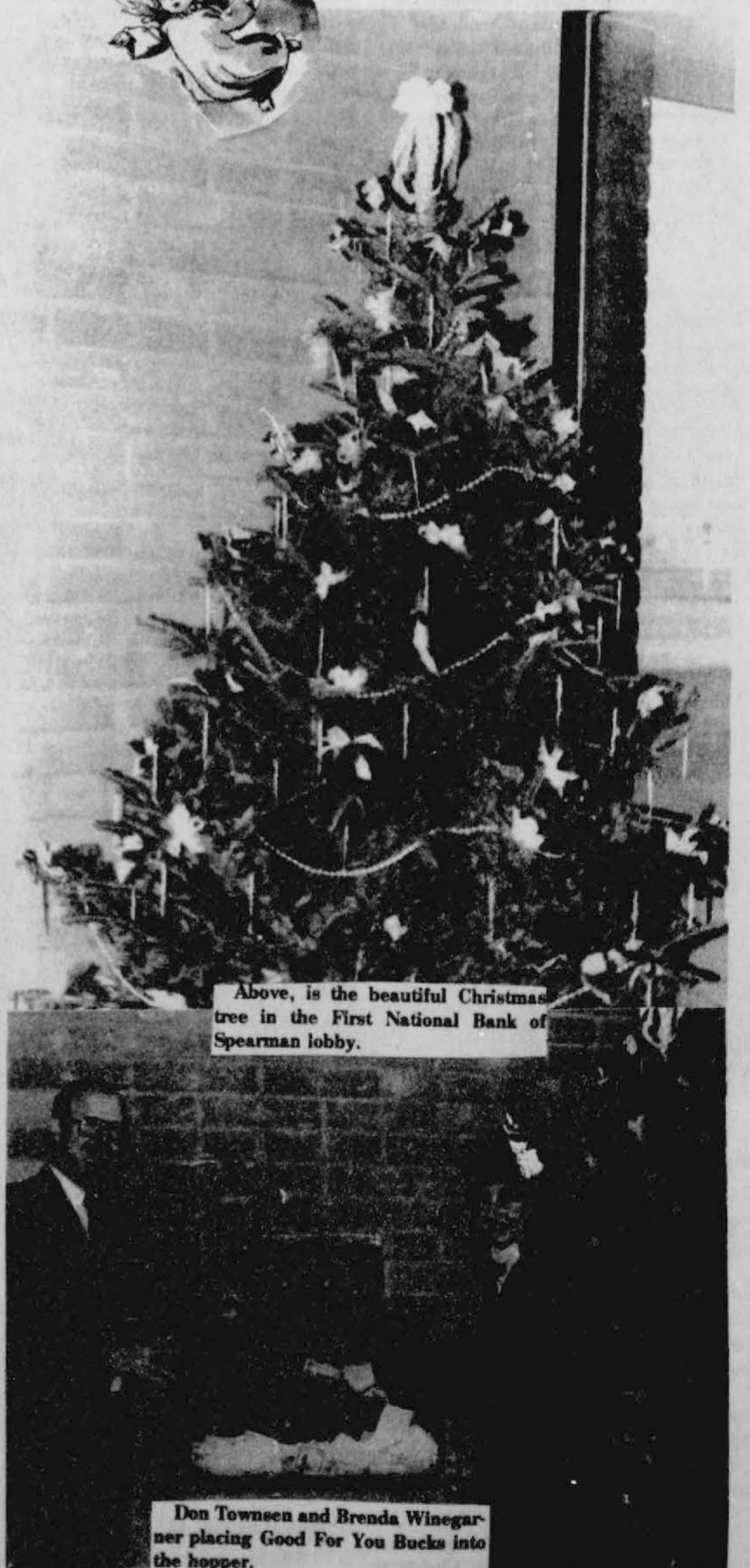

A botanist in Philadelphia, Robert Buist, received cuttings and sent specimens on to the botanical gardens in Edinburgh, Scotland. Poinsett may have introduced the flower to California when he visited John C. Fremont there. The Mexicans and people of Central America call the poinsettia "Flor de la Noche Buena" (Flower of the Holy Night) because it blossoms fully at Christmastime.

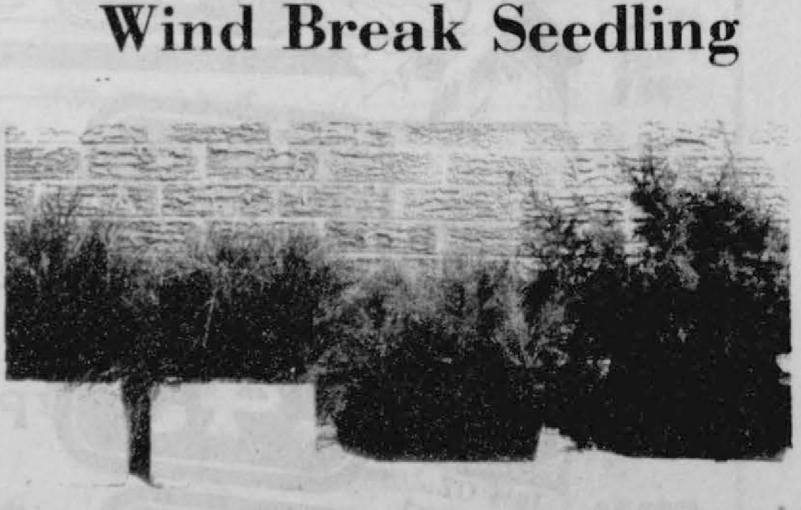

**Wind Break Seedling**

These seedling trees and shrubs are made available to rural landusers for use in establishing farmstead and feedlot windbreaks.

Windbreak seedling orders are now being taken by the Hansford Soil & Water Conservation District. The trees will be priced the same as last year. Thirty potted evergreens will cost \$35 and 100 of the deciduous type trees and shrubs, which are sold bare-root, will be \$40.

These seedling trees and shrubs are made available to rural landusers for use in establishing farmstead and feedlot windbreaks.

Some of the species available include rocky mountain juniper, eastern red cedar, austrian & ponderosa pine, russian olive, green ash and honeylocust.

Orders must be placed by March 1st but ordering at the earliest possible date is encouraged as the most popular species soon sell-out. Payment must accompany the order.

Order blanks and windbreak design information is available at the Soil Conservation office located at 505 W. 11th in Spearman or by calling 659-2330.

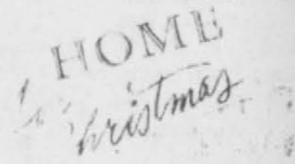

As of June 30, 1986, the Sheshunoff Rating Service gave First State Bank a rating of A plus, ranking the bank in the top 7% of all banks in the state and the top 14% of all banks in the nation. For the five years ending in 1985, return on average equity was 14.04% and net chargeoffs divided by average loans averaged a low 0.78%. 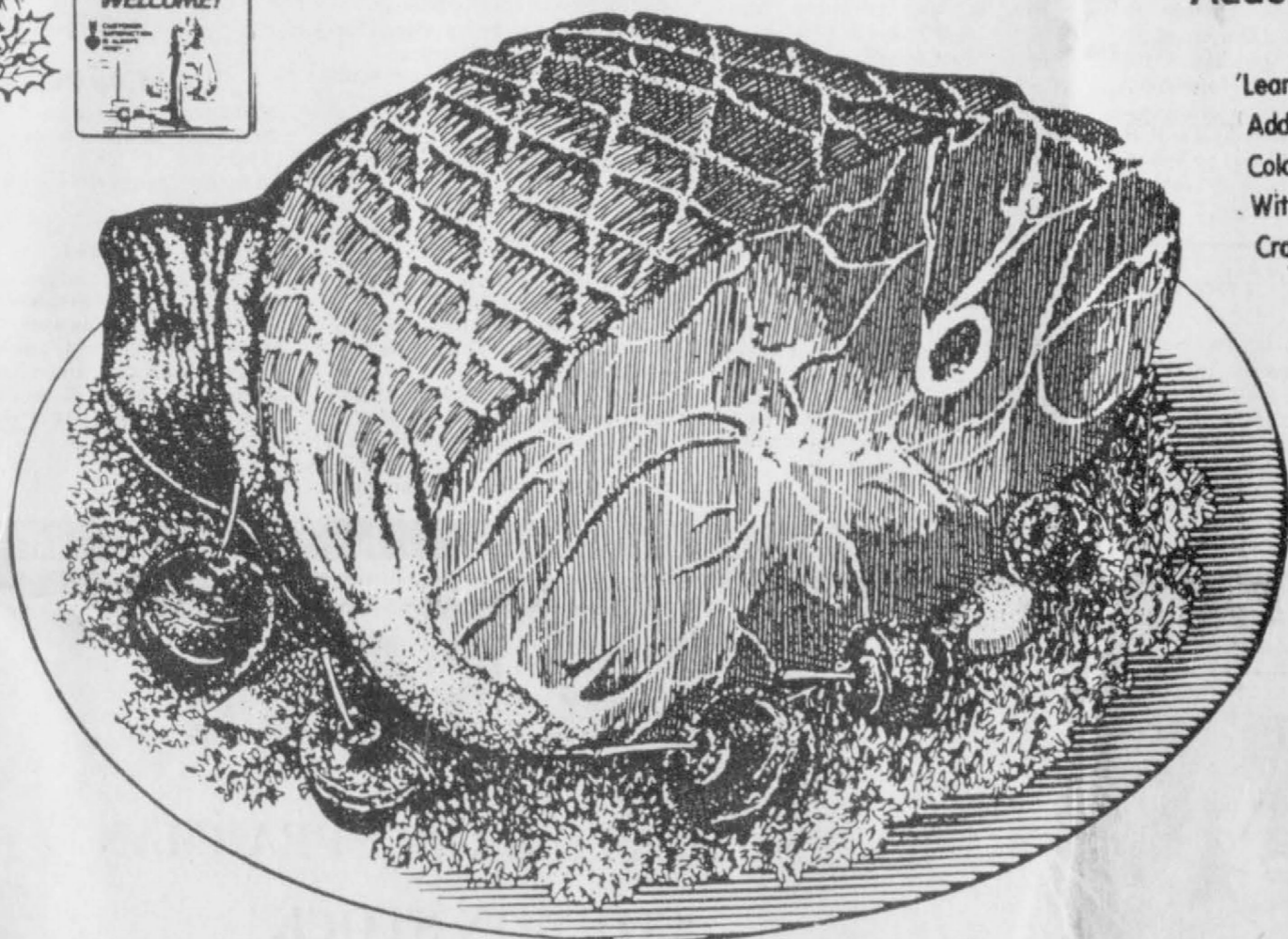
