explains, "the heating process breaks down the egg's natural defense mechanisms and creates an ideal growth medium for bacteria."

shell eggs are rare, but cases of taphylococeal food poisoning commonly oceur with hell monly occur with improper handling and refrigeration of a variety of egg
products, such as salads, custards, and deviled eggs. Even an uncracked egg can absorb bacteria, and cooking greatly educes the egg's defense agains "The bacteria can be transmil
