## USDA extends farm program deadline

 Saturday, Feb. 18, extended by three weeks the deadline for farmers to join the 1884 USDA programs. The announcement of deteils was released shortly before 5 p.m. The USD The USDA is lifting a controversboth wheat and skip-row farmers to plant cover crops on land idled as part of the 1984 farm programs.
