## Research Seeks To Increase Yields

## Monday Will Be Partial Holiday

Monday will be only a par tial holiday in Spearman in observance of July 4, which The Post Office, all county and city offices and busines es not related to harvest planning to close . Farmers the world over are looking for ways to make higher yields in crops, and at the Himp plains the cost. Foundation, Halfway, Texas has been working on a system o help solve this problem In 1958, the Foundation began research in what was called "skip-row interplanting" now known as High Plains Foundation Farming System. Foundation, only the rows planted are irrigated. In this method, irrigation water is allowed to run between the planted rows.
Water conservation is not the only advantage of this system of farming. Yields are boosted in both of the crops grown as
is the quality. The yield increase of the crops by far offset having one blank row every set having

Foundation personnel have found through research that these are some of the advantages of skip-row. interplant ing: (1) ra ise production
farm income; (2) conserve irrigation water and speed irri gation; (3) lower production use of a vaila the best possibl (5) improve cotton quality (6) maintain organic matter level of the soll; and (7) re duce wind and sand damage to seedling cotton.
The grain sorghum and other crops interplanted with cottor help to cut down on the wind action blowing around the cotton. This, along with the blank row, heips to keep the
soil temperature up for better cotton fiber development.
