## Make-Believe

 Meat in Future"Make Believe" meat-*a substitute for red meat and poultry could have a severe impact upon the economy of Texas, says Ed Uvacek, Exspecialist, Texas A\&M University.

Recent developments in the use of spun fibers of soybean protein as a substitute for almost any food with natural fiber texture may bring this
problem closer to farmers and pronchers in the foreseeable future.
The fiber can be treated to imitate such foods as meat, dried fruits, potato chips, nut kernels and many vegetabies, be given any flavor desired. Substitution of synthetics for farm products is not new. Ny lon, rayon, dacron and othe synthetic fibers have cut deeply into wool and cotton utilization. Soybeans or other substitutes for meat is therefore
too surprising. folded in the future. Since these synthetics are new, re search is still in progrefss and many product developments and consumer res ponse problem still have to be worked out. In Texas, livestock provides
the major source of farm income, and any development in the competition for meat production could have a substantial effect upon the in come and type of products pro duced by individual farme and ranchers.
Currently, synthetics are not yet major competitors wiolopments, however, Texas producers may face some sever problems in the competition for real meat.
