Father of Spearman woman receives Prisoner of War medal in Canadian

Editor's Note: The following article is being reprinted with permission Y. C Canadian Record. resident Sumner, Andita (Mrs. Dwight) Sumner, and grandfather of Shane,
Liz, and Missie Sumner, is making Liz, and Missie Sumner, is making from brain surgery performed last June. He was presented with a Prisoner of War medal Tuesday which he earned forty-four years ago in France when he was taken risoner by the German Army. Army Reserve, presented the medal, which was only recently authorized by the Army, in a quiet private ceremony at the Lopez
home?

Corporal Y.C. Lopez, of Cana dian, Tx., was a machine gunner in
the 315th Infantry Regiment, 79th Division, in France in the fall of 1944 when he was taken prisoner $i$ the action leading up to the Battle of the Bulge. He was taken prisoner by the Germans at Stas burg. France, on October 3, 1944 and was a prisoner of war at Moose
berg Stalag 7-A in Germany until he was released in April 1945. When asked about how Mr.
Lopez was treated in the war, Anita
said, "It was not a pleasant experience. Dad will not talk about it, expect on a rare occasion. It was
a subject we just never brought up." Mr . Lopez did relate to his family imprisoned. He found shoes when wooden shoes, which he wore while in prison. His only other means of
protection was an old raincoat. His wife, Theresa, thought the prisoners had their shoes taken For his action with the 70th Division, he was awarded the Bronze Star medal and the Purple Heart. He holds a Combat Infantry. man's badge.
But the Prisoner of War Medal is a new one. It was authorized by Congress last Spring for any per-
son who served honorably as Prisoner of War after April 15 . 1917.
"Your medal recognizes the special service and sacrifice you have given for this Country," Secretary of the Army John 0 .
Marsh Jr. wrote in awarding the Marsh J
medal.
"The front of the medal is an eagle, symbol of the United States and the American spirit," Secre-
tary Marsh writes. "Although surrounded by barbed wire and bayonet points, it symbolizes the hope that upholds the spirit of the prisoner of war. On the reverse, space to words "Awarded to" is a and below this is your name, naming the purpose of inseription 'For honorable service while prisoner of war.' The shield is from the Coat of Arms of the United States of America.
The medal was
The medal was designed by the United States Army's Institute of
Heraldry. Designs were solicited Heraldry. Designs were solicited
from the military services, veterans organizations and private citizens, and over 300 proposals were submitted. A Joint Service Panel reviewed all of the proposals and selected the design submitted by
Jay C. Morris, a civilian Jay C. Morris, a civilian employee
of the Department of the Army of the Department of the Army.
The public law authbrizing the Prisoner of War Medal specifies that the medal shall be accorded a position of precedence in relation to other awards and decorations
immediately following decorations immediately following decorations awarded for individual heroism,
meritorious achievement or service, and before any other service medal, campaign medal or service ribhon authorized to be displeryed.

Eventually all students entering pass TASP tests in reading, writing and math skill areas before advanc ing to upper-division courses.
While all colleges in Texas are
working hard to implement the working hard to implement the
TASP test and follow-up with compensatory courses for needing remedial help, it is safe no segment of Texas higher education is as prepared for
this newest challenge than are its this newest challenge than are its
49 community college distriets. 49 community college districts
Compensalory instruction has bee a part of the community college
mission since the beginning of th mission since the beginning of the
movement, and most community movement, and most community
colleges have tested entering stucolleges have
dents for years.
