## Organize Booster Club

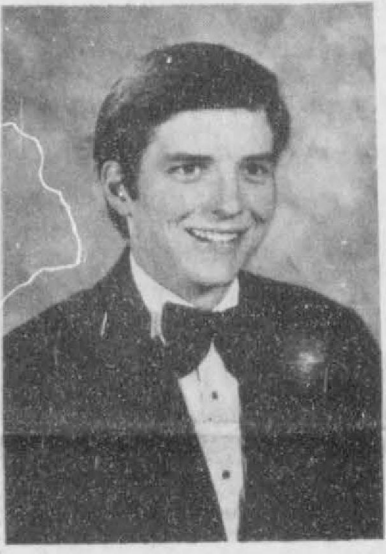

In 1976, Texas experienced its lowest recorded death rate of 2.6 for every 100 million miles traveled. This low rate is in spite of a significant increase in vehicular miles traveled.

Members of the safety and law enforcement communities recognize that a large contributing factor was the increased usage of safety belts due to the new law and public education of the lifesaving and monetary benefits of belt usage.

Fatalities in the seating positions covered by the law decreased an average of 14 percent in September through December, the first four months after the law's effect date, compared to the same period in 1984.

The 101 days of summer are days which include happy leisure time travel for young and old alike across Texas and across the nation.

Historically, the safety community in Texas and throughout the country has participated in public awareness campaigns to increase safety belt usage to help keep those 101 days happy travel times.

The Texas Coalition for Safety Belts is comprised of more than 40 public and private sector organizations which through their state offices, local entities and local projects are working to increase public awareness of the benefits of safety belts.

Member groups of the Texas Coalition will be joining safety advocates in other states in an "All American Buckle-Up" to remind travelers to use their safety belts for themselves and their belts and child safety seats for their young passengers.

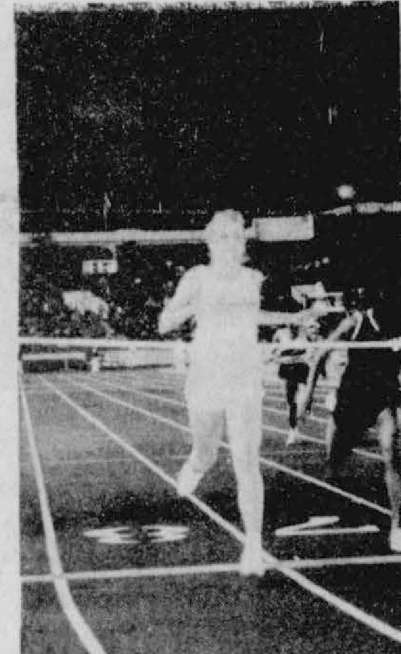

## Love Letter to the Dear Folks in Gruver and Hansford County:

We have always appreciated living in this county because of all the wonderful people here, but not as much as we do now! Your caring concern, many acts of kindness, and your prayers helped sustain us in a very difficult time. We do not have addresses of all of those who gave blood but we have your names and please know how deeply this was appreciated. If you could have seen some of the things running around the streets of San Diego, you would understand our grave concern for good blood sources.

The doctors and nurses were impressed with the blood drive responses and how much was collected for Kip - a total of ninety pints - truly phenomenal considering the choices were later narrowed to O. We are told that 6% of the general population has this type, so some of you gave more than once. This is truly the gift of life and many others would have given if they had the same type.

The doctors admitted that the Panhandle of Texas must be the best source of healthy blood known today!

They had never had a patient who enjoyed the volumes of mail daily that Kip did. Each card and letter and call was a light in a dark time - to us as well as to Kip. Somewhere in southern California people know just how special and different folks are in the Texas Panhandle. One young hematologist is being tempted to move to Texas when his stint in the Navy is completed after seeing us through the last five months and being convinced that there is a better way in Texas!

We felt like royalty in our "coming home" reception. Frank & Kip were met at the airport by a welcoming party. Luke and I drove straight through which was another in a long list of memorable events. Luke's part in Kip's treatment was the most vital of all and he performed it without missing a beat at school, so his Freshman year at college has been successfully completed.

When we were within smelling distance of home (still in a foreign county) an officer of the roads stopped us to say our sticker was five months out of date and that we were exceeding the legal speed limit, "Thank you for your kindness and concern, sir."

But finally - what a sight for reddened sleepless eyes! Home! There were yellow ribbons in the trees and welcome home banners everywhere. Food, fruit baskets, and flowers awaited us. How truly overwhelming.

If you ever find yourself in a rut taking your dear good neighbors and friends for granted, you might try five months in a foreign land to remedy that.

Kip is now recuperating at home with weekly trips to Harrington in Amarillo for CBC's (complete blood counts) and platelet counts. His complete recovery will take time as he still tires very easily, but he has already climbed many mountains and crossed many valleys by the grace of God.

Thank you for helping to bear our burdens. "May our God supply your every need according to His riches in Christ Jesus."

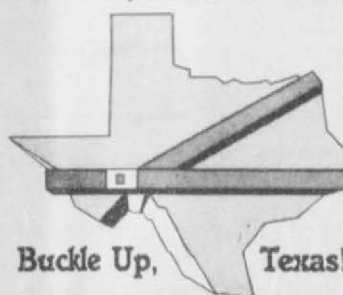

### 20th Century Club Installs Officers

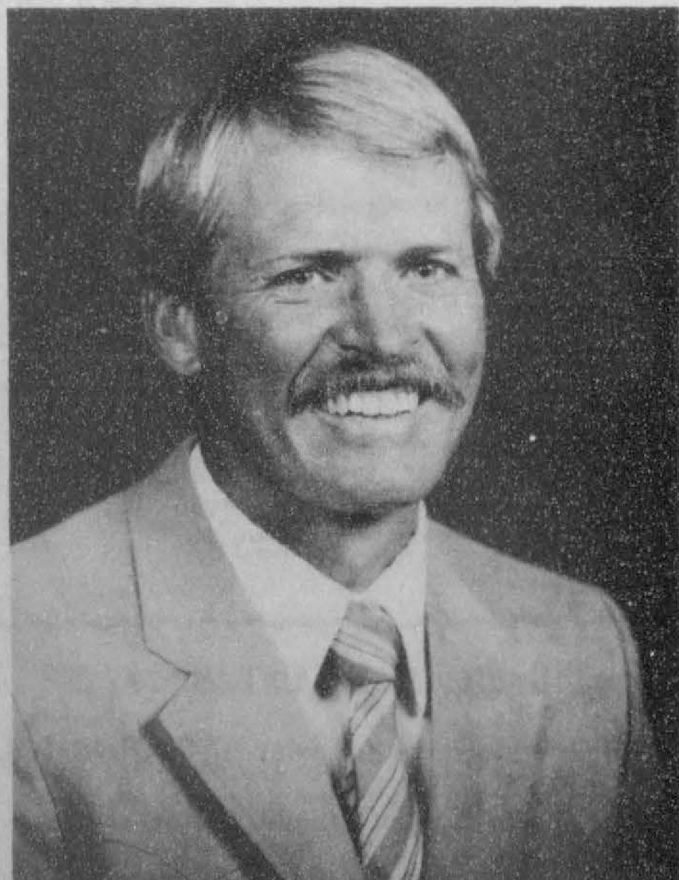
