In 1925. Texas experienced its lowest recorded death rate of 2.6 for every 100 million miles traveled. This low rate is in spite of a significant increase in vehicular miles traveled.

Members of the safety and law enforcement communities recognize that a large contributing factor was the increased usage of safety belts due to the new law and public education of the lifesaving and monetary benefits of belt usage.

Fatalities in the seating positions covered by the law decreased an average of 14 percent in September through December, the first four months after the law's effect date, compared to the same period in 1984.


